

Bills to Free Indians Offered

WASHINGTON — Bills to end federal jurisdiction over eight Indian tribal groups, including the Klamath and the Grand Ronde-Siletz groups in Oregon, have been submitted to Congress, Secretary of Interior McKay said Wednesday.

Also affected would be all Indians in California, Florida, New York, and the Flatheads of Montana, the Turtle Mountain Chippewas of North Dakota and four tribes under jurisdiction of the Indian Bureau's Potawatomi field office at Horton, Kan.

McKay said the bills vary in detail, but that all provide for an eventual end of federal trusteeship over Indian property, and to make the Indians subject to the same federal and state laws as other citizens.

He said the bills would affect about 66,000 Indians, roughly seven percent of the Indian population as estimated by the Indian Bureau.

McKay said federal responsibility for such special services to the Indians as roads, health and education also would be ended.

"Ample time is allowed, however, for the completion of arrangements under which the Indians would receive customary services from state and local agencies on the same basis as other citizens," he said.

"The bills contain provisions designed to protect the interests of minors, incompetents and other individual Indians who will need such protection after federal trusteeship ends, he said.

Rushing Named Albany's Citizen

Albany — Clyde Rushing, president of the Albany Chamber of Commerce, Tuesday night was named winner of the Junior First Citizen award for 1953.

Rushing was selected by an anonymous board of judges for "rendering the most outstanding contribution to the community in the past year."

Besides being elected president of the Chamber of Commerce for 1954, Rushing was a chairman of the Albany area Red Cross fund campaign during March. He also has served on the board of directors of the chamber and of the Rotary club.

Rushing, manager of Pict-sweet Foods since he came here in 1947, also was active in the industrial committee of the Chamber of Commerce.

Presentation of the award was made by Harold "Hayes" Evans, 1952 Junior First Citizen.

The honor is given annually to an outstanding young man of Albany between the ages of 21 and 36. The Albany Junior Chamber of Commerce sponsors the award banquet.

Dr. Victor P. Morris, acting president of the University of Oregon, gave the evening's address on "The Measure of a Community."

The speaker was introduced by Rex Putnam, state superintendent of public instruction and former superintendent of Albany public schools.

French Troops Begin Offensive

Aboard Troop Transport Off Tuybo, Indochina — French Union forces storming ashore on the coast of Annam in a drive to wrest control of the area from the Communists. Led by Vietnamese paratroopers, 250 French troops landed Thursday after copying Tuybo, 250 miles north-west of Saigon.

The French command described the landings as the first big scale French-Viet Nam offensive in the seven-year-old Indochinese war.

"For several years all French military actions have been of a defensive nature," a spokesman said. "This phase is ended. Despite heavy Vietnamese pressure, the French command has succeeded in grouping sufficient forces to take the initiative in an offensive."

The strong land, air and sea offensive started at dawn Wednesday when 2,500 French Union troops landed near the town. Supporting forces advanced north along the coastal road from French-held Nhatrang, 45 miles to the south.

Censorship Law Brings Protest

PORTLAND — Oregon laws have made censorship possible in publications of the State Department of Higher Education, the president of Oregon State College warned Wednesday.

He said the laws now give the Department of Finance power to scan copy and decide whether to print it.

Dr. A. L. Strand, head of OSC, said the intent of the laws obviously was to give the Department of Finance power to eliminate unnecessary publications. The result, he added, is to give the department director the power of censorship.

Harry Dorman, the finance director, agreed, although adding that he has no intention of exercising any power of censorship.
