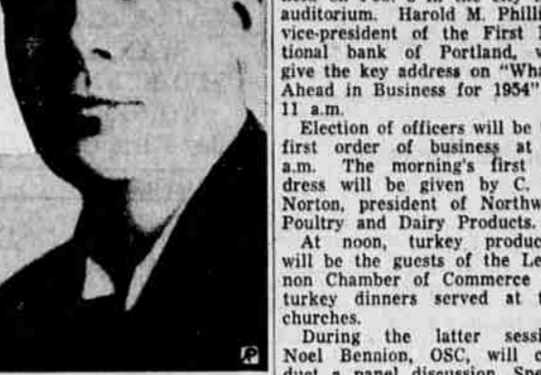

## Ben Lampman, Passes Away

PORTLAND, (UP)—Ben Hur Lampman, 67, Oregon's poet laureate and associate editor of The Oregonian, died yesterday at a local sanitarium of arterial sclerosis.

Lampman's writings have been published in collections and included in anthologies, as well as printed in national magazines. His most popular works dealt with nature as he saw it in everyday life.

He was designated Oregon's first poet laureate in 1951.

He was born in Barron, Wis., in 1886, and had been a member of The Oregonian staff for 35 years. He founded a newspaper in North Dakota as a young man and was publishing another newspaper at Gold Hill, Ore., when invited to join The Oregonian.

After many years as a reporter and feature writer, he became an associate editor.

Lampman was author of six books, including two which were collections of his writings for The Oregonian—"How Could I Be Forgetting?" and "At the End of the Car Line."

Survivors include his widow, Lena Sheldon Lampman, and two daughters, Mrs. Carolyn Cooper, Portland, and Mrs. Hope Fisk, Los Alamitos, Calif. Funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. tomorrow in the Morninglight chapel of J. P. Finley & Son.

## Oregon Population Gain 7.1 Per Cent

WASHINGTON (AP)—California, Washington and Oregon were among states reporting population

increases between the April 1, 1950 census and an official estimate July 1, 1953, the Census Bureau said Sunday.

California led the way with a 14.2 per cent gain, from 10,415,000 to 11,867,000 to replace Pennsylvania as the nation's second most populated state.

Oregon gained 7.1 per cent, from 1,519,000 to 1,625,000, to place 16th in percentage gain, and Washington's population went up 5.9 per cent, from 2,317,000 to 2,442,000 and placed 19th.

New York remained first among all the states with a July 1, 1953 estimated population of 15,100,000.

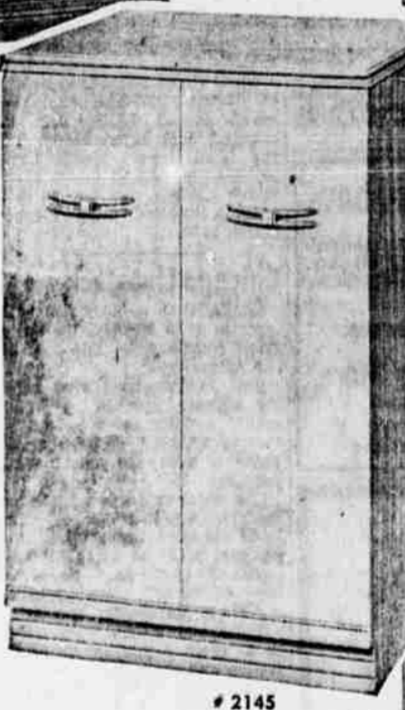

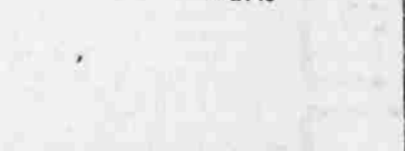

### A Bit Of This-'n-That

### QUESTION: What is a Mutual Insurance Company?

Mutual insurance is the oldest form of organized insurance in the U. S. Its operation is virtually the same as Stock companies except it has no paid-in capital by stockholders. Thus, paid-in capital is not available to a Mutual in the event of a catastrophe.

Mutual insurance usually costs less. The policyholder either pays less at the inception of the policy or a certain percentage of the premium is returned to him at the end of the policy term in the form of a dividend. Actually, the policyholder is a member of the company and is entitled to certain privileges. His policy will state that he is entitled to attend the annual meeting of the company and the time and place of the meeting is indicated. He has the right to vote but, we might add, few policyholders avail themselves of this opportunity.

Some Mutual companies require a membership fee—some do not; some are fully or partially assessable—some are neither. In any event, the special conditions that apply are required by law to be incorporated within the policy form itself.

This is not to infer that Mutual insurance, as such, is not desirable. However, if the important comparative features are equal, the stock company will usually have a greater loss-paying ability which, after all, is why we buy insurance.
