WASHINGTON IP — The Army announced Wednesday a big field maneuver in North Carolina this spring to train troops in defenses against atomic weapons, guided missiles and other new warfare devices

The Army said it will use its

The Army said it will use its 280 mm cannon, capable of firing both atomic and conventional explosives, but there was no indication that actual atomic shells would be utilized.

About 60,000 soldiers will take part in the exercises to be held in April and May in the Ft. Bragg-Camp MacKall area of North Carolina. The figure does not include air units to be supplied by the tactical air command. # \$500,000 for **Probing Reds**

WASHINGTON UP-The Senate apparently set itself Wednesday to invest upward of half a million dollars in work of its two subcommittees which trail Communists.

1. It voted \$228,000 for its internal security subcommittee, headded by Sen. Jenner (R-Ind).

2. The Rules Committee en-dorsed a fund of \$216,000 for Sen. McCarthy's (R-Wis) investigations subcommittee. This is yet to be passed on by the Senate itself.

The money for Jenner's subcommittee was approved by voice vote without objection although a Sen. without objection although sen.
