

'Cats to Pacific Saturday

7 of Next 10 Games Are Away

Only Northwest conference action of the week will occur when Bearcats and Badgers gnash their teeth Saturday night at Forest Grove in a game which won't change standings no matter which way it goes.

Willamette university's 4-0 record compares to Pacific's 2-5 cellar rating and the nearest threat to the Bearcats is the still young season is College of Idaho (4-1), Whitman (4-4) and Linfield (3-3). The thought that chills coach John Lewis occasionally is the idea that seven of the next 10 Bearcat games are on the road where hospitality is rare.

Lewis said today that his starters will be the solid five who have surprised some early season proponents, Pete Reed and Dick Hoy at forward, Jerry McCallister and Dunne "Lefty" Shield as the play-making guards.

On the opposition roster are at least three scoring dangers, Norm Hubert, runner-up to R. C. Owens in conference bucket busting; Clint Agee, the 6-7 center; and Danny French, 6-2 forward. Hubert is one of the more effective point and playmakers.

The bout will be on radio (ABC) and television (NBC) starting at 10 p.m., EST.

Bevo Averaging 47.4, 16 Games

NEW YORK (AP)—When Bevo Francis scores less than 47 points, he's having a bad night and the Rio Grande (Ohio) hot shot has been having very few of them this season.

Latest small-college basketball figures released by the NCAA Service Bureau show the elongated center has tossed in 759 points in the 16 games he's played for a healthy average of 47.4 points per tilt.

Francis added 136 points in three games last week to his already sizable total.

His closest competitors are Carson Lovett of Franklin and Marshall with a 32.3 per game average and Bob Hopkins of Grambling who has scored 591 points in 22 games.

Viks Open Series Tonight On Court at Marshfield

Furman's Selvy to Break 3-Year Hoop Record Soon

NEW YORK (AP)—Fabulous Frank Selvy from Furman University figures to break basketball's all-time individual scoring for a three-year major college career record sometime within the next 10 days.

He can keep up his most recent pace he will do it before the week is over.

A Scoring Marvel

Selvy is a scoring marvel, the likes of which never before has been seen on a basketball court.

After two seasons of play with the Greenville, S.C., school he has scored 1,803 points. He needs just 86 more to pass Kansas' Clyde Lovellette's record and he has 15 regular-season games to play.

Marshfield has rolled to 12 wins against four losses while Salem has an eight-four mark, with all four losses going to high ranked teams. They have lost to Eugene, Corvallis, Milwaukie, and Roosevelt of Portland.

Lineups Familiar

Coach Harold Hawk, assisted by Lee Gustafson, probably will start Erickson and Pickens at the forwards, Wulf at center, and Knapp and Domogalla at the guards.

The Pirates probably will use Steve Bigelow and Sandy Fraser at the two forward positions, Wayne Young at center, and Bob Ayre and Ron Jones at the guards. Marshfield, a consistent state title threat, is the defending champions but they have lost all their starters from last year.

Marshfield rolled to a 67-52 win over Corvallis while the Vikings were beaten 52-38 by the same Spartans. Marshfield topped Eugene 72-61 while Eugene beat the Vikings 63-52 a week ago. The Pirates split a series with Grants Pass, a team Salem plays next week-end.
