


> ALBANY-To fill and refill is a question among restaura-teurs in Albany concerning the rising price of coffee. How-ever, levying a charge for a coffee cup refill has been making an appearance in Albany -on the heels of the upping of wholesale and retail coffee prices, A check with 13 Albany

A check with is Albany restuarant operators revealed that six recently begun charg-ing five cents or a dime for the second cup, two are ex-tracting payment for the third cup but not for the second, and one has boosted his price to a dime—having been selling it until recently for a nickel.
