### Today's Menu

This casserole boasts a delightful flavor combination.

**Fish Fare**  
Macaroni-Crab Casserole\*  
Green Peas Salad  
Bread and Butter  
Gingerbread Beverage  
with Applesauce

**Macaroni-Crab Casserole\***  
Ingredients: 1 tablespoon salt; 2 quarts boiling water, 8 ounces (2 cups) elbow macaroni, 1/4 cup butter or margarine, 1/2 pound mushrooms (cleaned and sliced), 2 tablespoons flour, 2 1/2 cups milk, one 6 1/2-ounce can crabmeat, 1 tablespoon minced onion, salt and pepper, 1/2 pound cheddar cheese (finely diced).

Method: Add 1 tablespoon salt to rapidly boiling water. Gradually add macaroni so that water continues to boil. Cook uncovered, stirring occasionally, until tender. Drain in colander. Melt butter in a saucepan; add mushrooms and cook gently until tender. Remove mushrooms; blend flour into butter remaining in pan. Add milk all at once; cook and stir over low heat until thickened. Mix sauce with macaroni, mushrooms, crabmeat and onion; add salt and pepper to taste. Turn into buttered 1 1/2 quart casserole; sprinkle with cheese; bake in moderate (350F) oven 40 minutes. Makes 6 servings.

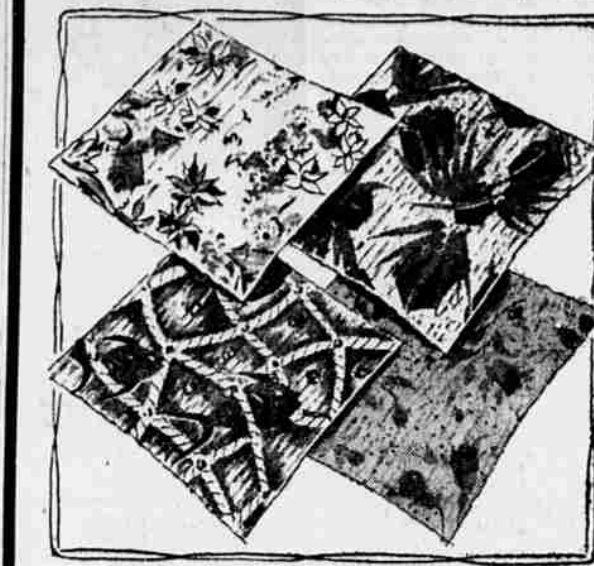
