

May 15 Armed Forces Day

May 15 was announced as the date for Armed Forces Day in 1954, when Secretary of Defense Charles E. Wilson this week announced preliminary plans for the nation's observance of that event.

"Power for Peace" is to be the slogan for the day, which is devoted to honoring men and women of the Armed forces and programs will be designed to give the public a better understanding of the personnel, equipment and working relationship of the Armed Services, National Guard and the Reserves.

Open houses at military and naval installations, educational exhibits, demonstrations, air shows, drills, parades, award ceremonies, vessels in port and other special events will all be a part of the programs planned for the observance throughout the nation and wherever Americans are stationed.

Rear Adm. Bertram J. Rodgers, commandant of the 12th Naval district, San Francisco, has been designated as the military man to coordinate the observance of Armed Forces Day observances in the eight Western States. At a later date names of the military men heading state groups planning for the event will be announced and the state chairman will name chairmen in local areas.

Heavy Snowfall In Michigan

Light snow or rain fell in a few Midwest and Northeast areas but generally fair and comparatively mild weather prevailed in most parts of the country Thursday.

Snow in the Midwest was confined to Northeastern Illinois, Northern Indiana, Eastern Wisconsin and most of Michigan. Snow falls appeared heaviest in Michigan with 7 inches reported in Lansing and 5 inches in Grand Rapids. Snow also fell over New York State and Northern New England and changed to rain along the Southern New England coast. Boston reported nearly a half inch of rain in 6 hours.

Temperatures early Thursday ranged from 10 above in West Yellowstone, Wyo., to 71 above in Key West, Fla.

Farmers in Buyers' Market

MADISON, Wis. (AP)—Asst. Secretary of Agriculture John H. Davis told farmers Thursday they are now in a buyers' market in which the customer "holds the upper hand."

"Once again," he said, "it is necessary to cater to the customer's wants. Once again there is need for good merchandising and aggressive selling so as to move the products we have available for the market."

In a speech prepared for a Farm and Home Week program at the University of Wisconsin, Davis said farmers must recognize that prospective buyers are no longer begging for U.S. farm supplies, as they did during the years directly after World War II.

Mad Dog Bites 14 Persons in Chicago

CHICAGO (AP)—At least 14 persons were bitten Tuesday night by a dog which died a short time later and was found Wednesday to have rabies.

Dr. Herman N. Bundesen, president of the Chicago Board of Health, said the victims range in age from 6 to 41 years and "face almost certain death" unless they present themselves for anti-rabies shots.

Some received first aid treatment for bites, but did not take the shots.
