## TV Tower Goes To Foothills

Formal submission of an amended application for KSLM-TV, was announced today by Glenn McCormick, president of Oregon Radio, Inc.

The application to the FCC requests a change in power to the allowable maximum of 100,000 watts total radiated power on VHF channel 3, and a change in transmitter location from Eola Hills to Highland Butte, in the foothills of the Cascades. The new tower site is 1728 feet above sea level, at which point a 500-foot transmitting antenna will be erected.

McCormick said he expected formal approval by the FCC within 30 days and as soon as permission is granted, construction will begin immediately on a television facility estimated to cost a half-million dollars, that will bring Grade A coverage to most of the Willamette valley and Portland. Studio facilities will be located in Salem at a site yet to be determined.
