Haley told the board there isn't any way for it to go to court to find out if the Board of Control could buy the reformatory site with part of the \$1,250,000 which the

part of the \$1,250,000 which the Legislature appropriated to build the institution.

Atty, Gen. Robert Y. Thornton ruled that the site can't be bought with that appropriation, because the Legislature didn't give the Board of Control the authority to purchase a site.
