### State Employs 10 Students

Ten public administration students at Willamette university are currently employed in the offices of the state of Oregon under a new internship program under arrangements made by A. Freeman Holmer, associate professor of political science.

The students, all seniors in liberal arts, are enrolled in a special upper division political science class and have a weekly hour seminar in addition to their work in the state agencies.

Holmer said that plans are being made to employ about 20 students in the area in a summer internship between the junior and senior years. He added that public administration departments of all Oregon colleges were expected to cooperate in this program.

### \$77,246 Sought In Truck Crash

ALBANY—One of 13 persons injured when an uncontrolled logging truck crashed into a Trailway bus east of Cascadia Oct. 7, 1953, has filed a suit in circuit court here asking a \$77,246 damage judgment against the owner of the truck, Irwin Updegrave.

Marie T. Foster, state tax commission employe, is the plaintiff and alleges that in the accident she sustained a skull fracture, injured eye and many other injuries that have incapacitated her.

The plaintiff, according to news accounts of the accident, was listed as one of the three most seriously injured in the crash.

The complaint alleges that the driver of the truck, Harold A. Sharp, had been fatally overcome by monoxide fumes from the truck exhaust just before the crash.

Responsibility for the escape of gas fumes from the truck engine is placed on the truck owner and defendant by the plaintiff.

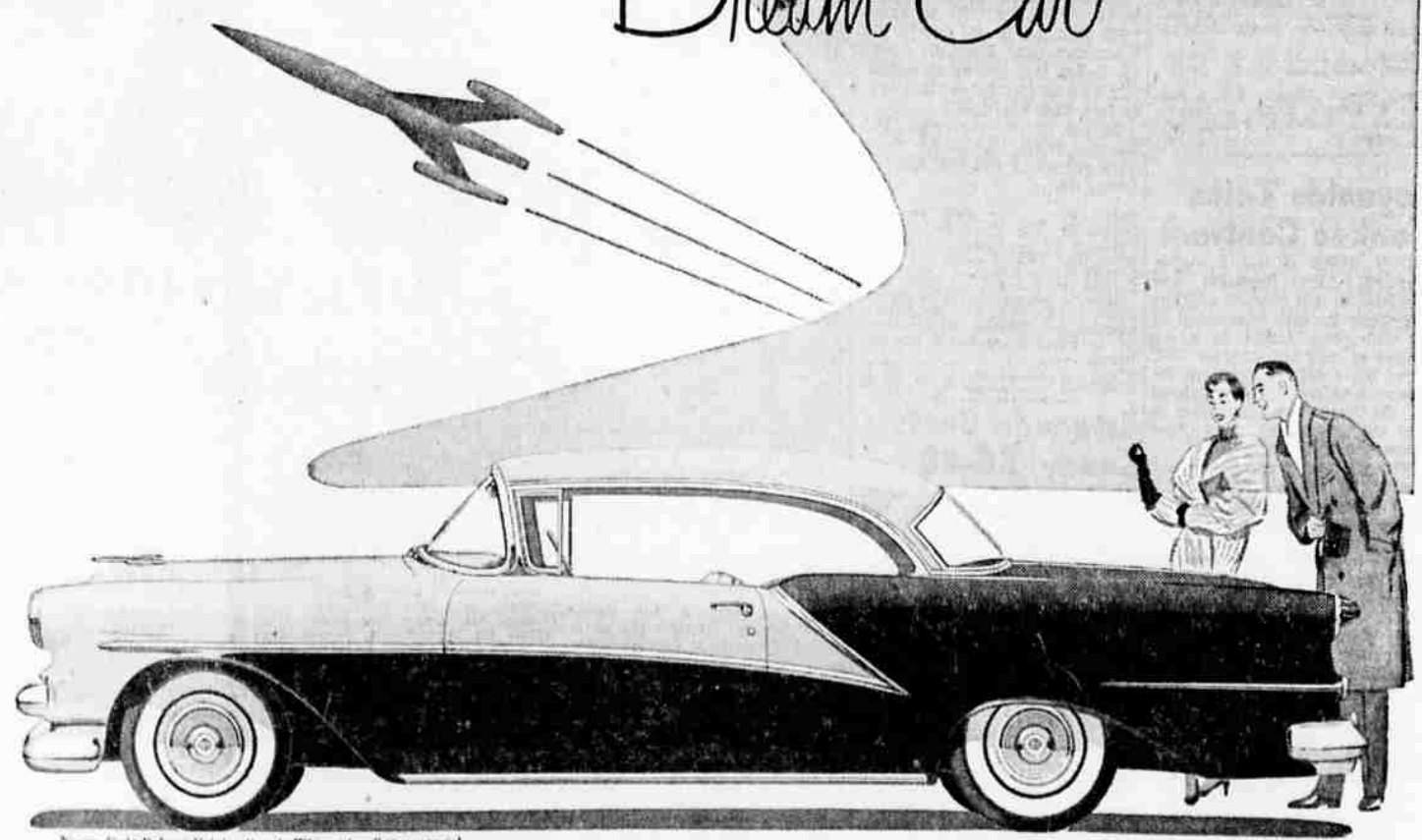
