Capitol could be placed. The original A-Bomb created three concentric rings in the New Mexican desert—a smaller ring in the center with the earth pushed down about 12 feet in places, a second ring of half-mile diameter where the earth fused and boiled, and an outor ring where the desert was denuded of plant life as if swept by a giant broom.
