Company Supper
This is a quick curry because you don't have to fillet the chicken.
Curried Chicken Steamed Rice
Green Peas Chutney
Salad Hot Rolls
Orange Ambrosia Beverage
Carried Chicken
Ingredients: 1 cup butter or margarine, one 2 1/2-pound ready-to-cook weight frying chicken, 3/4 cup coarsely grated onion (lightly packed), 1 medium-sized apple (peeled and coarsely grated), 4 teaspoons curry powder, 1 chicken bouillabaisse cube, salt and pepper, 1 1/4 cups boiling water, 3/4 cup cream.
Method: Brown chicken in butter in 10-inch skillet. Add onion, apple, and curry powder. Dissolve bouillabaisse cube in water; add to skillet with salt and pepper to taste. Scrape up browned particles from bottom of pan with wooden spoon. Cover and cook until chicken is tender. Remove chicken pieces; force mixture in pan through fine strainer. Return chicken and sieved mixture to skillet; stir in cream. Reheat but do not boil. Makes 4 servings.
