Forest Fire Losses Low

Forest fire losses on lands under the jurisdiction of the state forestry department and its cooperating protective association during the 1953 fire season was only \$29,831, the smallest figure since 1930.

The major portion of the losses, other than those under the classification of "miscellaneous" were in logging operations with a figure of \$6230. This entire amount, with the single exception of \$180 which represented log loss, was in logging equipment.

The largest fire occurring during the season covered 202 acres of land. This is the first time in the history of the forestry department that the largest fire for any one season has burned over such small acreage. Further, the announcement states that no damage on this fire was reported, because the fire burned through a slash in Douglas county.

Lightning caused the greatest number of fires—459 with a total loss of \$4,966. Careless smokers were next on the list causing 110 fires with \$1,975 damage resulting. A total of 95 fires with a damage of \$12,541, was attributed to miscellaneous causes. Other forest fire causes, the report said, were incendiary, camp fires, debris burning, slashing, logging operation and sparks from railroad locomotives.
