March 8 this group will meet with the County Soil Conservation supervisor in McMinnville to discuss their drainage problems and to request technical assistance.

L. H. Latham, engineer, and Ed Laird, conservationist of the Yamhill County Soil Conservation District, attended the meeting.

The farmers' objective for the present is to plan and construct a common drainage ditch to drain their own farms.
