Quick Buttered Snap Beans  
Ingredients: One 10-ounce package French-style frozen green (snap) beans, 1/4 cup boiling water, 1/4 to 1/2 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoons butter, pepper.

Method: Put frozen snap beans in saucepan. Add boiling water and salt; bring quickly to a boil separating beans with fork. Add butter and cover, keep boiling gently, stirring a few times, until tender and there is no more liquid in pan — about 10 minutes. Add more salt, if desired, and pepper to taste. Makes 3 to 4 servings.
