The tests were conducted at 12:15 p.m. on both Thursday and Friday. The signal, a coordinated sounding of the steamship whistle mounted on the roof of the Oregon Pulp and Paper company plant, and the city fire siren mounted in the tower of City Hall, was sounded for a three-minute period.

There were 57 official "listeners" distributed throughout the city, including two teachers at each school. In addition to the official observers, spot checks were made from the Salem Civil-Defense office following the Thursday test. An analysis of the reports from the official auditors and from those spot-checked was submitted to the state civil defense office. The analysis read as follows:
