William J. Costello, hearing examiner, rejected Mrs. Cooper's objection and ordered the exhibits admitted in evidence. Mrs. Cooper then waived cross-examination of Houston.

### Water Committee **Hears Problems**

ROSEBURG In - The State Water Resources Committee heard a different set of problems dis-cussed here Wednesday as it continued its tour of Western Oregon seeking data for a water development program.

ment program.

The major problems here, speakers told the committee, are flooding and silt in streams.

G. N. Riddle, former state representative from Riddle and a member of the South Douglas Conservation Assn., said flooding could be reduced by abolice stream. he reduced by planting cutover timber land with grass. The seed could\* come from government stockpiles purchased under support programs, he said.

G. Lloyd Hayes, director of the Siskiyou-Cascade research center of the U. S. Forest Service, said more reforestation and more con-trol over the location of logging roads would solve both problems.

The additional trees would reduce flooding and controlling the drainage from mountain logging roads would reduce the amount of silt in streams, he said.

Speakers also recommended construction of a multi-purpose dam on the South Umpqua River and creation of a permanent State Wa-ter Resources Commission.


