

Couple Wed Sunday; Woodburn

WOODBURN—The Church of God at Woodburn was the setting for a wedding on Palm Sunday, April 11, when Miss Patricia Ruth Houseweart, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Earl C. Houseweart of Woodburn, was married to Howard Allen Klopstein, son of Mr. and Mrs. Reuben D. Klopstein of Silverton.

The Rev. J. William Carlson of the Immanuel Lutheran church read the service at 3 o'clock in the afternoon in the presence of more than 200 invited guests. The church was decorated with pink carnations and pink and white stocks in tall baskets. The candles were lighted by the ushers. Soloist was Miss Robin Berkey of Hubbard who was accompanied by Mrs. Glen Abre, who also played the wedding marches.

Mr. Houseweart gave his daughter in marriage. She wore a traditional white wedding dress fashioned with lace bodice, pointed in front, standing collar, long pointed sleeves and full skirt of net over tulle. Floor length.
