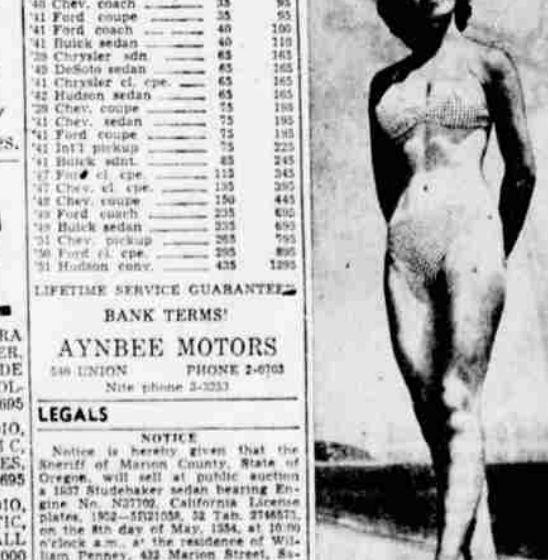
Police Arrest Youth On Car Theft Charge
