Funeral services will be held at the Virgil T. Golden Chapel Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock for Mrs. Pearl Kress Gilbert, who died at a local hospital Friday. Ritualistic services of Victoria Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star, will be observed and Rev. George H. Swift will be the minister. Mrs. Gilbert was born at Jacksonville, Iowa, July 17, 1879. In 1902 she was married in Iowa to David B. Smith, and later they came to Oregon. She was married a second time 15 years ago to Charles T. Gilbert of Shaw, who died two years ago. Mrs. Gilbert was a past matron of Victoria Chapter No. 76, O.E.S., of Turner. For several years she was employed with the State Industrial Accident Commission and also by the State Tuberculosis Hospital. She is survived by daughters, Mrs. Margaret Follett of Sweet Home, and Mrs. Gilbert Sessler of Seaside; sons, Donald Smith of Eugene, Waldo Smith of Salem, and Theodore Smith of Primeville; a sister, Mrs. Ruth Anderson of Jefferson; and nine grandchildren.
