Electric Future Bright for NW

ALBANY—Optimism about the future of the Pacific Northwest and its power supply was expressed Tuesday by Paul B. McKee, president of the Pacific Power & Light, at a dinner meeting of Albany area employees at the American Legion hall.

Major federal projects now building at The Dalles, McNary and Chief Joseph will add 3,000,000 kilowatts to the regional power supply, McKee stated, which will provide for a healthy growth in population and industry until about 1960.
