### Last Rites for Cora M. Davis

SILVERTON — Funeral services were held Monday afternoon from the Memorial Chapel of the Ekman Funeral Home for Mrs. Cora M. Davis, 90, the Rev. Arthur Charles Bates of Salem, officiating. Concluding rites were at the Woodburn Belle Pass cemetery.

Mrs. Davis died late Saturday evening at the Mill street, Silverton home of her son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Charles C. Davis, where she had been very ill for several weeks. She was the widow of M. C. Davis who died September 5, 1946, in Silverton, they had observed their 39th wedding anniversary the preceding January.

Cora M. Holcomb was one of a family of eight children born to Coral and Jane Holcomb, pioneers in 1837 of Colfax, Calif., where she was born May 7, 1864.

At the age of seven years, with her family she moved to Wendling, Ore., near Eugene, where her father logged off land for the family home. She attended the Wendling and Eugene schools and taught school in Lane county until her marriage at Springfield, January 5, 1887. They lived there for 25 years. Mr. and Mrs. Davis then moved to Woodburn. Ten years ago they moved to Silverton where they lived next door to the Charles Davis home.

A lifelong member of the Methodist church, she retained her membership in the Springfield pastorate, until 10 years ago when she became active in the Silverton congregation.

Surviving are two sons, Charles C. Davis of Silverton, and Wal-

ter E. Davis of Salem, nine grandchildren, and 17 great-grandchildren, a brother, Henry C. Holcomb of Colberg, Ore.; nieces, Mrs. William Hilton of Springfield, Ore., and Greta Franklin of Seattle, Wash.; nephews, Perry Davis of Port Gamble, Wash., Ray H. Holcomb, Eugene, Ore., and Wilmuth B. Gibson, Portland. Bearers were personal friends of Mrs. Davis, Ira Loran, Frank M. Powell, Carroll Rold, Otto Dahl, A. E. McCullough and Clarence Plank.
