Rep. Ellsworth Heard In Talk at Albany

ALBANY—Addressing a meeting of about 40 Republican campaign workers and others interested at the Republican headquarters, 320 West Second, last night Republican Harris Ellsworth of the Fourth Oregon district stressed the importance, both to Oregon and the nation, of a Republican majority in the next Congress if the Eisenhower administration's policies are to be carried out.

"There is nothing to the idea that the president can depend on the support of Democratic votes," said the congressman. "We do have reason to expect 50 to 75 conservative Democrats to vote with us. But what really counts is control of the committees. On the rules committee, for instance, which has a lot to say about putting a bill through the House, a place among the four minority members of this 12 man committee is about as valuable as an extra head on the human body. If the Democrats organize Congress, they will run the show, and they are not going to run it to help President Eisenhower but will work to weaken the President and elect a Democrat to succeed him in 1956." Ellsworth is a high-ranking member of the rules committee.

Ervin L. Peterson, head of the state department of agriculture, newly appointed assistant secretary of agriculture under Secre-

tary Ezra Taft Benson, was present and spoke briefly.

Mrs. H. C. Rowlee, president of the Albany unit of the Oregon Federation of Republican Women, presided. The federation women served tea at the close of the meeting.

Speeder Asks Court Review

ALBANY — In the first proceedings of the kind ever initiated in circuit court here, Albert Joseph Firchau, Lebanon, has filed a petition asking that the local court schedule a hearing for review of his conviction in Polk county on a speeding charge, and of the secretary of state's office suspension of his driver's license for a year.

Firchau's petition recites that on September 20, 1954, he was tried in the Polk county justice court and was convicted and was sentenced to five days in the county jail. Furthermore, he notes, the secretary of state's office acceded to the recommendation of the justice of the peace that Firchau's operator's license be suspended for a year.

The justice court action was unfair and unjustified, the petitioner claims, and he asks that the secretary of state's office be ordered to show cause why a judicial review should not be made.

Too Much Fat on Animals and People

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (AP)—Undersecretary of Agriculture True D. Morse suggested Wednesday it might be wise for human beings, beef cattle and even hogs to take off surplus fats.

In a speech prepared for a conference here of the National Assn. of Margarine Manufacturers, Morse said "one of the critical problems of agriculture can be stated as, not enough protein—too much fat and oil."

"We do not eat enough meat, milk, eggs, and other high protein foods according to doctors, dieti-



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Nurses Train For CD Service

Third in a series of civil defense training sessions for graduate nurses, nurses aides, and practical nurses, dental nurses, x-ray and laboratory technicians, and dietitians and other medical assistants will be held in the basement of the First Christian church in Salem, October 27 at 7 p.m., it was announced by Mrs. Harmon Yeary, chief of the medical assistants section for the Marion County Civil Defense organization.

The meeting of the Marion County group coincides with the conference for the State Nurses Association, which also has a civil defense program scheduled for this year's meeting.

The program is open to graduate nurses, nurses aides, nurses anesthetists, x-ray technicians, hospital dietitians and anyone who has been trained in first-aid or home nursing.

The October 27 program will include three demonstrations, a first aid station team, a hospital team, and the medical and nursing aspects of lodging centers for evacuees. Mrs. Nova Young, nurse consultant for the Oregon Civil Defense agency, said the series of meetings in Marion County is a pilot study that will set the pattern for similar training courses to be held in other counties. In May they considered the work of nurses and other medical assistants as related to Marion County civil defense plans, and the Oregon State Civil Defense plan. The second program covered organization and training of blood drawing teams. Five more sessions will be held in coming months.

The child's father is Air Force Capt. Orin Wood, stationed at Moses Lake, Wash.

Hospital attendants said the child showed some improvement Wednesday and was "fairly good."

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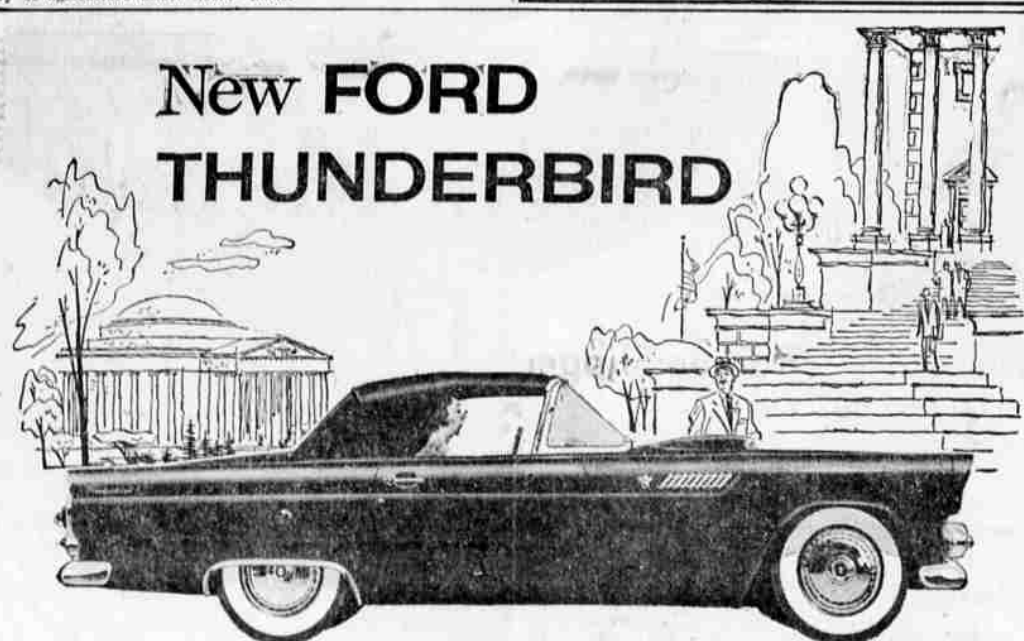
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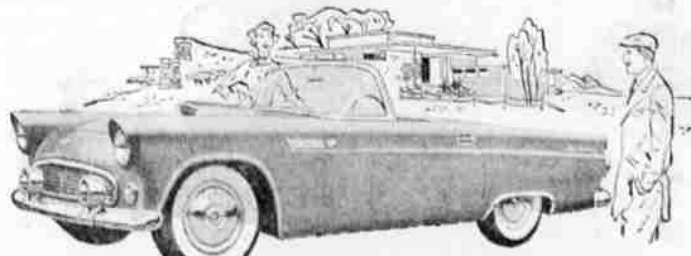
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
