N.Y. Doctor May Get Nobel Prize

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP)—Dr. Vincent du Vigneaud of New York, Cornell University biochemist, is described by the Stockholm newspaper Expressen as the likely winner of the 1954 Nobel Prize in medicine and physiology, to be awarded Thursday night.

The Expressen said there was a possibility, however, the prize would be given to three Boston doctors for polio research. There were strong indications Dr. Du Vigneaud, 53-year-old native of Chicago, would receive the Nobel Prize for research on two hormones produced by the posterior lobe of the pituitary gland, it said.

The three Boston polio experts were identified as Dr. John F. Enders, Dr. Thomas Weller and Dr. Frederick Robbins. The Nobel Prizes, which amounted to \$5,000 each last year, are awarded from a fund established by the will of Alfred Nobel, the inventor of dynamite. The prize in medicine and physiology was shared in 1953 by Dr. Hans Adolph Grebbs of Sheffield, England, and Dr. Fritz Albert Lipmann of Cambridge, Mass., for research on basic life processes in human cells.

Fish Closure Bill Attacked

PORTLAND (UP)—The Oregon State Fish Commission today reaffirmed its opposition to the initiative measure on the November ballot which would close coastal streams to commercial fishing.

John C. Veatch, chairman of the commission, said enactment of the measure by the voters "would have a disastrous effect on the conservation of the salmon runs in the coast streams."

The commission blamed diminished salmon runs less on commercial fishing than on destruction of spawning grounds by logging operations, removal of gravel from streams, removal of timber from watersheds, and silting of stream beds in summer months.

Veatch pointed out that runs in the Nestucca and Rogue rivers, which have been closed to commercial fishing for years, are constantly declining.

"This decline," he said, "has not been due to over-fishing in the rivers but partly to the destruction of natural spawning grounds and partly to fishing on the high seas."

He asserted that the proposed measure would remedy neither of those destructive causes.

About 90 per cent of U.S. imports of dried, whole eggs come from Sweden.

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PUD Favored For FPC Permit

EPHRATA, Wash. (AP)—The Grant County Public Utility District looked to the nation's capital Thursday for formal issuance of a Federal Power Commission permit to proceed with preliminary plans for a multi-million dollar dam at Priest Rapids on the Columbia River.

Glenn Smothers, PUD manager, said the district, advised by Sen. Magnuson (D-Wash) the FPC was preparing to issue a preliminary permit, said the first step will be a go ahead to a firm which recently submitted the low bid for test drilling at the site.

Magnuson, in his announcement here Wednesday, said his office in Washington reported the permit would be issued to the PUD sometime Thursday.

The FPC decision reported by Magnuson gives the PUD another round in its skirmish with the State Power Commission over which agency should be permitted to build the dam.

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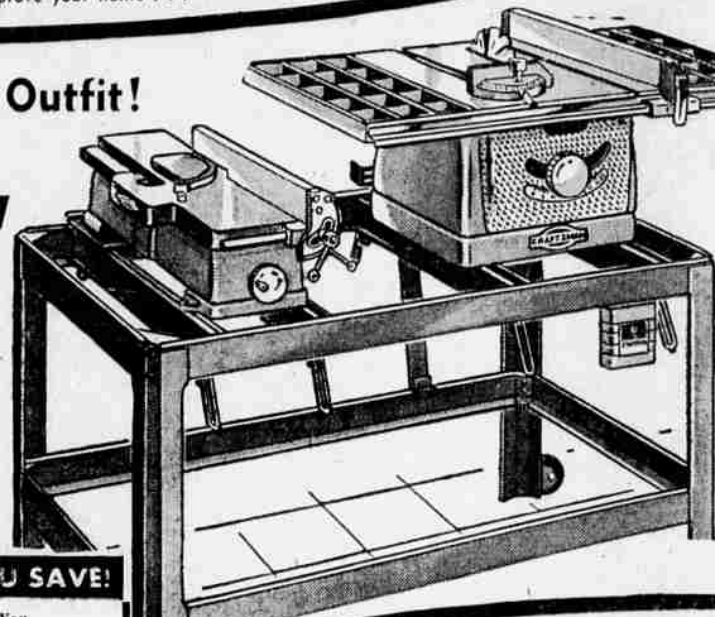

Cost \$5 Million To Scrub Fumes

SPOKANE (AP)—The Kaiser Aluminum and Chemical Corp. said Wednesday work will be completed this week on a 5 million dollar system to "scrub" the fumes that come from the eight potlines at its Mead Reduction plant.

Kaiser said six of the potlines have been covered since last fall and the control system will be ready on the other two by Friday.

Farmers in the Mead and Greenbluff areas near the plant had raised questions about possible fume damage to agriculture.

Kaiser said the control system draws smoke and fumes off each electrolytic cell at the plant by air suction. Ducts carry the smoke off each aluminum pit to large water "scrubbing" units by means of 300-horsepower fans.
