Miss Edler will be married October 30, 9:30 a.m. at the St. Joseph's church in Salem.

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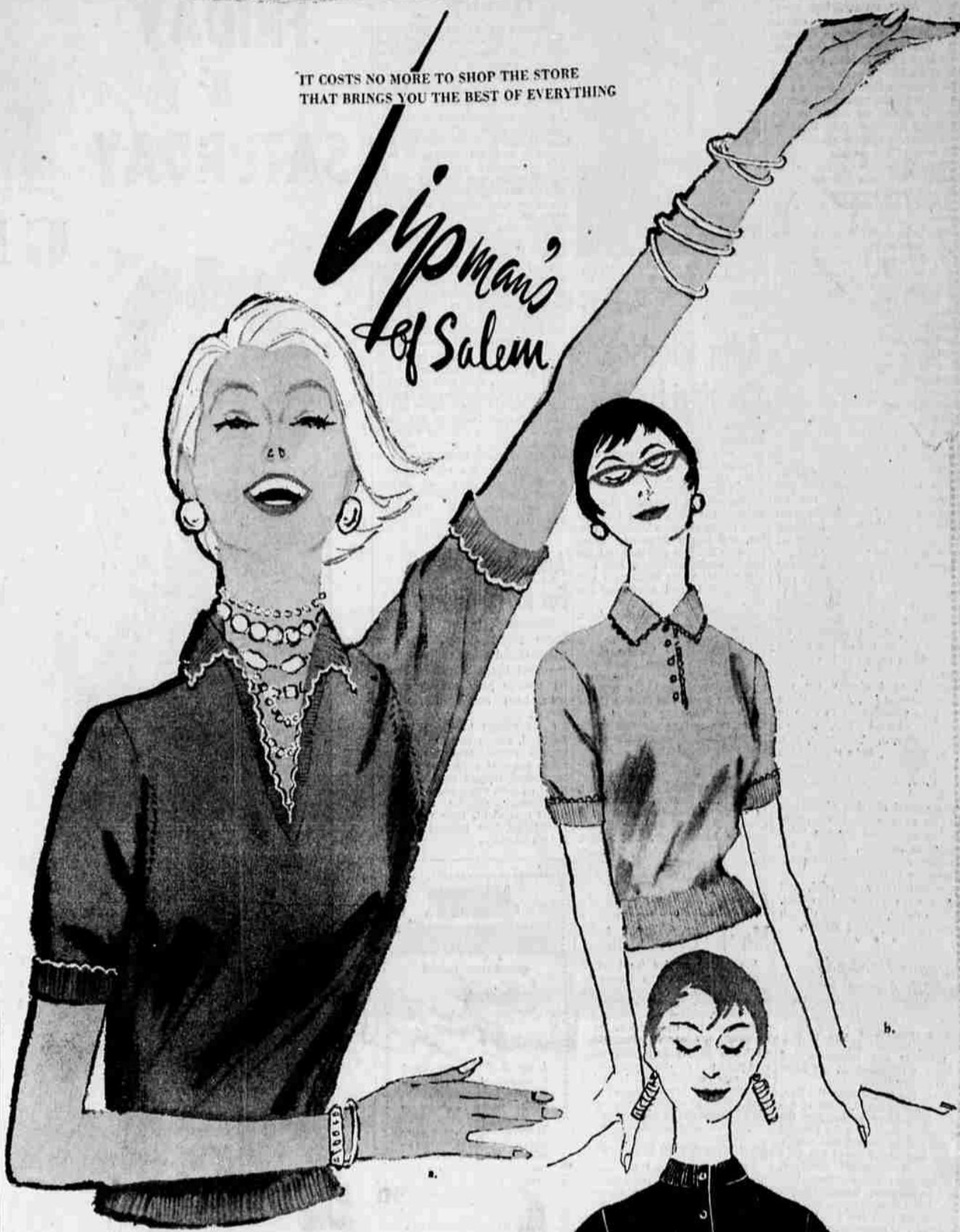
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
