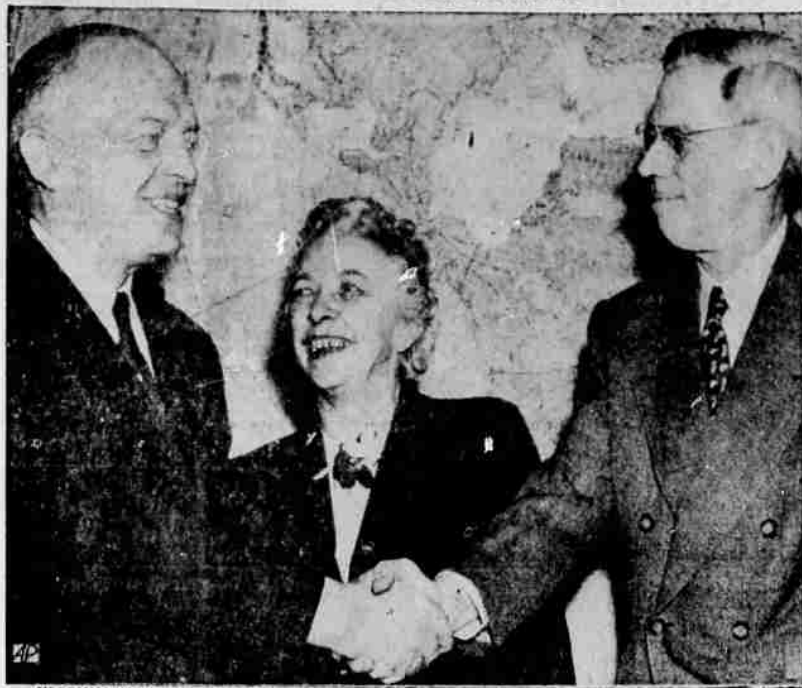

3 Idaho Members Fight Federal Dam Legislation

WASHINGTON (U)—Three of Idaho's four members of Congress may be expected to fight legislation to authorize a federal Hells Canyon Dam in the Snake River between Idaho and Oregon.

They are Sen. Dworshak and Welker and Rep. Budge, all Republicans.

Among those of the other side of the controversy will be these members from the two states bordering the continent's deepest canyon: Sens. Morse and Neuberger and Rep. Green, Oregon Democrats, and Rep. Plost, Idaho Democrat.

These Democrats, among others, made speeches advocating the federal project upon introduction of the authorization bills March 8.

Dworshak and Budge debated against the bills at that time, and they, along with Welker, stated their views fully in separate interviews later.

The bills would authorize a half-billion-dollar federal project in the area where the Idaho Power Co. is seeking license to construct three smaller dams at an estimated cost of 133 million. The firm's applications are before a Federal Power Commission examiner.

Dworshak told a reporter he may offer a substitute for the Hells Canyon bill. If it reaches the Senate floor following committee action, he said the substitute would authorize something other than a "political project."

"I'm convinced the high Hells Canyon Dam is purely a political dam without a real multiple-purpose benefits which would accrue from a more practical site," Dworshak said.

The proposed Nez Perce Dam is the Snake, downstream from Hells Canyon, and Bruce Eddy in the Snake, downstream from water, are among other "feasible sites which would provide more flood control than Hells Canyon," he said.

"I sincerely hope that in the near future an agreement can be reached on the most practical dam site and an end can be put to the political bickering which is retarding the development of the resources of the Columbia River's upper watershed," he added.

Welker said he would study the situation thoroughly before making up his mind on the issue but that "generally speaking I'm opposed to the government going in to the power or any other business where private enterprise could do the job."

"I don't want to see the states of Washington and Oregon interfering with the water rights at the headgates of a single farm in Idaho," Welker said.

Budge said he considered Senate Interior Committee hearings on the Hells Canyon bills scheduled next month in the Pacific Northwest to be "purely political."

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\$41 Million for Indian Education

WASHINGTON (U)—The House Appropriations Committee recommended Monday that \$41,674,000 be appropriated for Indian education and welfare services for the year beginning July 1.

This is the amount budgeted by President Eisenhower and an increase of \$4,614,332 over the amount appropriated for the year ending June 30.

In its report to the House, the committee said the increase would permit the Indian Bureau to place an additional 5,100 Indian children in school, provide foster home care for an additional 363 and relocate an additional 2,500 off reservations.

"It is anticipated that substantially all Indian children in the continental United States who are eligible and willing to avail themselves of schooling will be in school during the 1956 fiscal year," the committee said.

The annual Interior Department appropriations bill authorizes the secretary of the interior to buy eight acres within the Klamath reservation in Oregon, for construction of two pumping plants and an equalizing basin for the Modoc Point Indian irrigation system.

He also would be authorized to acquire up to 400 acres within the Colville Indian Reservation in Washington for construction of Mill Creek reservoir in the Nespelem unit of the Colville Indian irrigation project.

Newport Gets Office For Indian Listing

DON C. Foster, director, Portland Area Office, Bureau of Indian Affairs, announces opening of a field office in Newport for the purpose of preparing a roll of Indians who are lineal descendants of the Molokai, Molokai, Umpqua, Calapoos, Tillamook, Coquille, Toootone and Chetcoe tribes or bands of Oregon.

The roll when completed and approved will be used to distribute the Western Oregon judgment fund to those found eligible to participate.

Applications must be filed on or before August 30, 1955, by, or on behalf of each person who was living on August 30, 1954, and who is considered to be a lineal descendant of the tribes or bands.

It is planned to send representatives of the bureau to each community in Western Oregon to distribute forms for applications and to assist in their preparation.

Welcome to Graham By People of Glasgow

GLASGOW, Scotland (U)—Hymn-singing Scotsmen gave a fervent welcome Saturday morning to American evangelist Billy Graham. He is here to conduct a six-week religious crusade.

Graham was greeted by 1,000 persons who jammed a platform at St. Enoch's railway station. The first thing he said when the singing stopped was that he comes as a humble person, frightened at the great responsibility placed on him.

Immediately he was caught up in a swirl round of affairs. At a news conference he told 150 reporters he is avoiding tricky questions.

The American evangelist refused to discuss Princess Margaret's reported romance, the political aspects of making H-bombs, the worth of a three-power conference, or the prospects or projected international prize fights.

His story, he said, is the Bible and he carried a copy of it as

he stepped from his train and walked with a committee of Scottish sponsors.

The hymn-singing welcome began for Graham as his train crossed from England to Scotland near Dumfries.

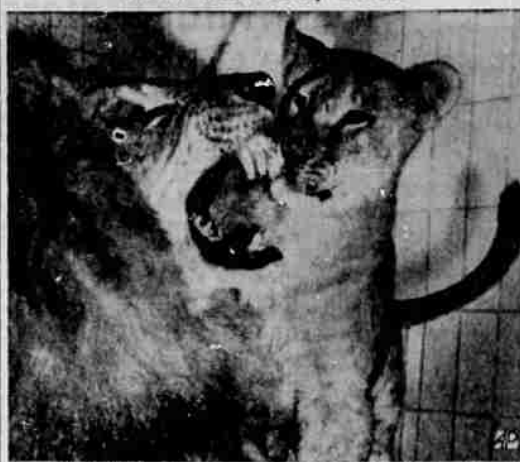
At the Dumfries station a crowd of persons, many of them middle-aged women, were singing "All hail the Power of Jesus' Name."

"I was in bed, but I thought if these people can get up so early to sing a hymn I can get up to talk to them," Graham said.

At the Glasgow station the hymn was "Tell Me the Story" and Graham grasped as many hands as possible and joined in a few phrases of the hymn.

The Rev. Tom Alan chairman of the committee of Scottish churchmen, said the American evangelist would have a potential audience of 1½ million persons over a telephone relay hookup while he is speaking in Glasgow's Kelvin Hall.

WASHINGTON (UP)—Rep. John W. McCormack (D-Mass.) was a declared candidate for the Democratic presidential nomination next year for about two seconds Sunday.

McCormack reeled off a list of possible Democratic candidates on the CBS television program "Face the Nation." When the program drew to a close he was asked if he would care to add the name of "McCormack."

"I would be happy to," he replied. Then, realizing what he had

said, "Who? me? oh, no!" McCormack caught himself just in time, seconds later the program went off the air.
