

### Calls to Urge Road Safety

Do not be surprised if you receive a telephone call reminding you that you may save many lives by driving with care and with courtesy when you make that fourth of July week-end trip. Salem's Junior Woman's club is participating in the General Federation of Women's club's drive for safe driving over the fourth week end. The drive is the nationwide move for safe living on the part of a national organization of clubs. Newspapers and radio stations have been contacted and are cooperating with the club here, as also are members of the Salem Ministerial association. Marking the beginning of the "Telephone Crusade for Safe Driving over July Fourth" will be the pealing of Salem church bells at 10 a.m. Wednesday, June 29. Immediately afterward members of the Salem Junior Woman's club will start their chain of calls, with each member to call four persons. The hope is that each person called will make four more calls. In telling of plans for the chain calls the organization reminded that over the fourth of July week end a year ago 348 persons were killed. Named to head the local club's committee is Mrs. Cliff Bowder. Working on the committee with her are Mrs. Richard Allen, Mrs. Robert Carey and Mrs. Donald Dougherty.

### McKenzie Pass to Be Opened Thursday

EUGENE — Snowplow crews working through the McKenzie Highway drifts from the east and the west were within a half mile of each other Tuesday, and the

highway will be opened to traffic Thursday. That was reported here by D. J. Sage, in charge of the district maintenance office for the Oregon State Highway Department. He said the snow was from 3 to 14 feet deep and the crews would be pressed to both open a route through it, then widen it enough for traffic Thursday. However, he said, he expected this to be done. The opening is later in the season than usual.

### Bank Bandits Sought in Italy

NAPLES, Italy (UP)—Naples police searched waterfront dives and hangouts today for four men and a woman believed to have masterminded the record \$305,000 robbery of a New York bank last April 6. Interpol, the 38-nation international police agency, flashed a warning to Naples authorities the group of five was believed to have reached Naples from France and was seeking passage to a foreign country to evade the police net. Police knew the names of the five but refused to give additional details while the chase was on. They would say only that three of the men were New Yorkers, that one man was from Manchester, England, and a 37-year-old Canadian woman was involved. "Publication of the names at this moment might wreck all our work," one Interpol official said. Interpol said the five persons were believed to be the desperadoes who held up the Woodside branch of the Chase Manhattan Bank for a record haul of \$305,000. They were known to have entered Italy from France June 16.

### Judge Clears Accused Dr.

PORTLAND (AP)—U. S. Judge Chase Clark, in a ruling Monday, said that a malpractice charge against a doctor proved only that he was "an able and skilled physician and surgeon." The defendant was Dr. Peter S. Ford who now is stationed with the Air Force in Portland but last year was in practice at Burns. While there, a needle broke in the course of closing an incision. He located it with X-ray and removed it two days later. Suit for \$50,000 was brought by Mrs. Frank Garber of Sacramento, the patient, charging negligence. Judge Clark said the breaking of a needle was not evidence of negligence, while finding the fragment disclosed "unusually good judgment and ability" on the doctor's part.

### Farmer Cooperative Raided by Burglars

Burglars broke into the Stayton Farmers' Co-op Monday night and made off with about \$240 in cash and some merchandise, state police and the Marion County Sheriff's office reported Tuesday. The cash was taken from an un-locked safe and from a counter tray. Most of the cash, about \$190 was taken from the tray. A considerable amount of electrical appliances also were taken, officers said. Method of entry into the building was not reported.

### Fair Catches, Salmon On Lower Columbia

ASTORIA (AP)—Commercial catches of salmon on the lower Columbia after the first full day of the season brought reports of "generally fair catches." Reports from dealers gave average catches per boat at about 200 pounds. One boat—the top catch reported—checked in almost 1,000 pounds. Fishing this year with larger mesh nets to allow blueback salmon to escape, fishermen reported only one or two bluebacks taken by scattered boats. The state fish commission ordered larger mesh nets used in an effort to revive depleted runs of bluebacks. It is early, however, for the blueback run which should become heavier late in the month.

### Security Plan Needs Revision

WASHINGTON (AP)—The administration said Tuesday a Democratic-sponsored plan to broaden social security payments needs "a thoroughgoing review and inquiry." These were the words of Secretary of Health Hobby in a letter to Chairman Cooper (D-Tenn.) of the House Ways and Means Committee which began closed-door sessions on the issue Tuesday. Republican congressional leaders also added the President's voice to the GOP clamor for public hearings on the proposed changes. By a straight 15-10 party line vote, the Democrats overrode a Republican effort Tuesday morning to open up the question for public hearings. Backing this "more study is needed" theme of the GOP committeemen, Mrs. Hobby wrote Cooper that "a thoroughgoing re-
