CHILLED TOMATO CUCUMBER SOUP
Ingredients: 1 can (10½ ounces) condensed tomato soup, 1 soup can water, 1 small clove garlic (peeled and minced), freshly-ground pepper, ½ medium-sized cucumber, 2 tablespoons lemon juice.
Method: Stir soup, water, garlic and pepper to taste together; chill. Wash and dry cucumber; partially pare so you have a striped effect; slice very thin; there should be about ½ cup. Mix cucumber with lemon juice; chill. Just before serving stir soup, mixture and cucumber together. Serve in chilled bowls. Makes 4 servings.
