At the close of the meeting refreshments were served by the committee, Mrs. Dick Boyvert, Mrs. Howard Devoe and Mrs. El-

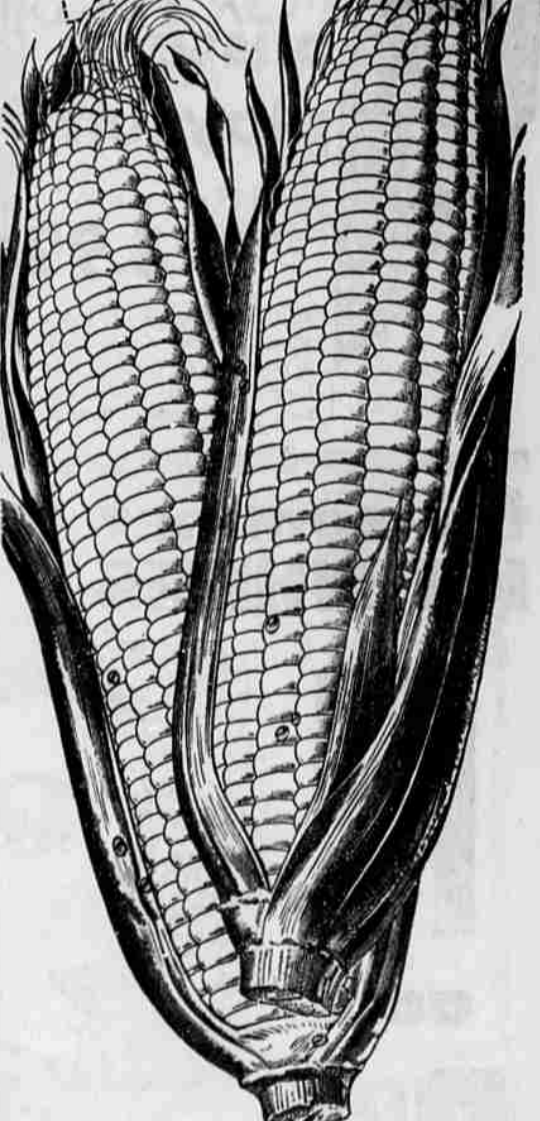
