

Northwest Quakers to Gather At Greenleaf, Idaho for Meet

Salem area Quaker churches will unite with those from meetings throughout Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Bolivia, S. A. as the nation's largest rural church located in the prosperous farming area of southern Idaho plays host to the 36th session of the Oregon Yearly Meeting of Friends at Greenleaf, Idaho, August 18 to 23. Board meetings will open on Tuesday morning. This will be the second time that the Northwest Quaker assembly is held away from Newberg, Ore., birthplace of the historic Friends development, according to L. Dell Lamb, Northwest Quaker promotional director.

Many Quakers in the Salem district have planned for their vacation to meet the yearly meeting schedules. General business and worship services will be open to the public, but elected representatives from each quarterly meeting will make up the nominating committees which will present names for all official boards and committees.

The Rev. Dean Gregory, general superintendent of Oregon Yearly Meeting of Friends, will head the delegation from this area and will present his annual report to the church on next Friday. The silver anniversary of the acceptance of the Aymara Indian mission work in Bolivia, S. A., will be observed on Friday with the Rev. Marshall Cavitt, on loan from the World Gospel mission to the Quaker field in Bolivia, will be guest speaker. The Rev. W. P. Lee, Boise, president of the board of missions, will tell of the developing opportunities in the field in his annual report.

Goldie Ruth Wells, former missionary to Africa, will speak at the Christian Women's Fellowship breakfast at 9:30 a.m. Aug. 18 at the First Christian church. Miss Wells was born in Dallas and was educated in Oregon schools. Miss Wells has spent most of her years in the foreign fields, working in Mombasa, Africa and the Congo Christian Institute near Bolenge. She is home on furlough which has been extended because of illness.
