DALLAS — Polk county farm operators were today reminded of the farm crop outlook meeting scheduled for Thursday, Sept. 22, at 8 p.m. in the Chamber of Commerce rooms of the Dallas city hall.

N. John Hansen, county extension agent, stated the meeting will include outlook information as to possible market outlets and prices on field crops for 1955.

Kim Roberts, extension agent, will discuss opportunities for fruit and vegetable production in the county, and some of the limitations on expansion anticipated in the future.

The highlight of the evening's program will be the presentation of awards in the Hanneken barley contest, which has recently been completed with 81 growers entering samples in the contest, it was stated by Bob Lorence, Monmouth, chairman of the committee.

All farm families of Polk county are particularly invited to attend and participate in the discussion of this important outlook meeting.

### Would Reveal A-Bomb Total

WHITE SULPHUR SPRINGS, W. Va. (AP)—A nuclear scientist has called upon President Eisenhower to reveal the size of this nation's atom bomb stockpile in the belief that the revelation "could be a potent force for peace."

Dr. Ralph E. Lapp, director of Nuclear Science Service in Washington and former consultant to the Atomic Energy Commission, said the stockpile already "amounts to several tons of TNT for every inhabitant of our planet."

The world's population is estimated at 2 1/2 billion persons.

Dr. Lapp said the pile is so fantastically large that there is no longer any point in keeping it secret. He spoke yesterday at a convention of the U.S. Tea Assn. Dr. Lapp described a hydrogen bomb which would produce the same destructive force as 18 million tons of TNT.
