

State Calls For Bids on 30 Road Jobs

The Oregon Highway Commission asked for bids Wednesday on 30 projects to cost \$6,300,000. Bids will be opened in Portland Nov. 3 and 4.

Some of the major projects are, by counties:

Douglas — Pave 6.83 miles of Shady-Booth Ranch unit of Pacific Highway, 5 miles south of Roseburg.

Douglas — Illuminate 16 points of access to new freeway on Anlauf-Shady unit of Pacific Highway.

Douglas — Construct 787-foot concrete bridge over South Umpqua River, a 275-foot steel deck truss, and 163-foot concrete grade separation structure on Pacific Highway 4.5 miles north of Myrtle Creek.

Josephine — Construct Merlin Hill underpassing 2 miles north of Grants Pass on Pacific Highway, southwest of Lakeview.

Lake — Surface and oil 5.46 miles of Westside-Dry Creek section of Westside County Road, 11 miles Sherman — Grade and pave 6.13 miles of Moro-Grass Valley section of Sherman Highway.

Baker — Grade and oil 2.54 miles of west unit, Black Bridge-Richland section of Baker-Homestead Highway, 32 miles east of Baker.

Cook — Grade and pave 1.36 miles of Coquille-Rink section of Coos Bay-Roseburg Highway, east from Coquille.

Grant — Grade and oil 2.02 miles of east unit, Hamilton-Long Creek section of Kimberly-Long Creek Highway.

Josephine — Construct 418-foot bridge over East Fork of Illinois River in relocated Redwood Highway at Cave Junction.

Wheeler — Construct 343-foot concrete bridge over John Day River at Service Creek on Service Creek-Mitchell Highway.

The owner of the calf declined to press any charges, police said, so the two men were arrested on charges of hunting game animals with the aid of a light. Spicer pleaded guilty in Stanton Justice court Wednesday and Solle pleaded guilty Thursday. They were fined \$100 each by Judge Walter Bell.
