CREAMED GREEN PEAS AND PORK
Ingredients: 1 package frozen green peas, 4 tablespoons butter or margarine, 1/2 cup finely diced onion, 1 pound mushrooms (sliced), 5 tablespoons flour, 2 cups milk, 2 cups diced leftover roast pork, 2 canned pimientos (diced), salt and pepper, 1 can Chinese-style crisp fried noodles.

Method: Cook peas according to package directions; drain; reserve 1/2 cup liquid or add water to make 1/2 cup. Melt butter in 10-inch skillet over low heat; add onion and mushrooms; cook slowly until tender, stirring occasionally. Stir in flour thoroughly. Add reserved pea liquid and milk. Cook and stir constantly over moderate heat until thickened and bubbly. Add pork, diced pimientos, and salt and pepper to taste. Reheat. Serve topped with fried noodles; crisp noodles in oven, then let cool again, before serving. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

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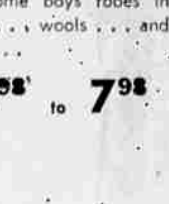

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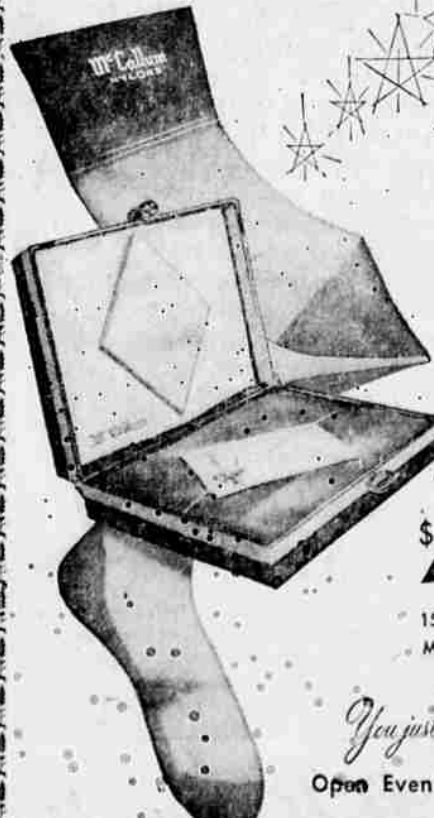
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
