Road Oiling Cost Jumps

The cost of oiling roads in Marion county next year is expected to be considerably more on a per mile basis than during 1955, said County Engineer John Anderson Tuesday as he submitted the report covering this year's operation as prepared by Assistant Engineer Ted Kuepzi.

The increase, the engineer said, would be brought about by heavier bases to withstand increasingly larger loads and the necessity for constructing better and wider shoulders.

The average cost per mile for new oiling this year was \$8,871.72. Next year it will probably exceed \$9000. Resealing work cost \$1,219.08 per mile during the oiling season of 1955.

This year's work included 17 miles of new oiling and 36,302 of old oiling or an over all increase of about 25 miles as compared with 1955. Total cost of operations was \$171,001.88. Of this amount \$117,478.85 went into new surfacing, \$44,254.85 into old oil projects and \$48,267.97 for bridge surfacing. Accounts receivable total \$8,800.89.

The highest cost per mile of \$10,431.54 insofar as new work is concerned occurred on the 2.23-mile stretch of the Victor Point road. Total expenditure on this job was \$23,262.33.

The least expensive job was the .59 mile project on the old Mill City road where the average cost was \$3,797.88.

Holt to Ask CCA Inquiry

LOS ANGELES — Rep. Holt (R-Calif.) said Tuesday that as a result of hearings into the tragic Joel Thorne air crash which cost nine lives he will demand a congressional investigation of the Civil Aeronautics Administration.

The lawmaker accused the CAA of "not doing a complete job of enforcing safety regulations."

Some time ago Holt held a hearing into the tragic crash of playboy Thorne's plane into an apartment house in the fog last Oct. Thorne and eight residents of the house died as a result of the crash and ensuing fire. The Civil Aeronautics Board is currently conducting a hearing on the matter.

"These hearings have convinced me more than ever that the CAA is not doing a complete job of enforcing safety regulations. There have been too many holes in its enforcement procedure," Holt said.

The congressman declared further in a statement: "Thorne was allowed to take off in fog, although he was not qualified to fly on instruments. This certainly indicates inadequate flight supervision by the CAA. Thorne was expelled from several airports but, because of lack of coordination among airports, he was able to move on to other fields."

Red Tag Tied On UE Union

By FRED S. HOFFMAN WASHINGTON — The Justice Department says the United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America (UE) is under the domination and control of members of Communist organizations.

The department leveled this charge yesterday in asking the Subversive Activities Control Board (SACB) to label the UE as a Communist-infiltrated labor union. The UE was ousted from the CIO six years ago on similar grounds. Many of UE's 100,000 members have been working on defense orders.

If the SACB should agree to brand the UE as Communist-infiltrated, the independent union would lose all standing and rights before the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB).

Albert J. Fitzgerald, president of the UE, said in New York that Atty. Gen. Brownell's "accusations against us are lies."

Logger Admits Beating Child

KLAMATH FALLS — A 29-year-old logger admitted in district court Tuesday that he had beaten and kicked his two-year-old stepdaughter.

Donald Mew pleaded guilty to assault and battery. Judge D. E. Van Vactor deferred sentence pending psychiatric examination of Mew. He had been arrested after neighbors complained the child was suffering a beating.

Belgium Ships Tanks to Egypt

LONDON — The Foreign Office said Wednesday 15 British World War II tanks have been shipped to Egypt by private Belgian dealers despite official efforts to block their export.

The tanks were loaded Monday at Antwerp aboard the Egyptian vessel El Khira. They were World War II Valentines and had been reconditioned by a commercial firm in Belgium for military use.

A Foreign Office spokesman told a news conference the tanks were shipped out of the country as scrap. He said the British government was tightening up its licensing procedures to prevent further unauthorized shipments.
