Jury Holds Mill City Chief Guilty

Verdict Given Today In Case Against Arlow Tours

Arlow Tours, police commissioner and former fire chief of Mill City, was convicted Wednesday of a "Peeping Tom" charge on which he was arrested last June.

A Marion County District court jury returned a unanimous verdict of guilty against Tours on the charge of interfering with the privacy of another.

The complaint charged that on June 18 Tours was trespassing on the property of Dale and Dovie Wood, Route 1, Box 226, Lyons, for the purpose of interfering with their privacy.

Dale Wood testified that after hearing a noise outside the house, he chased a man answering Tours' general description into the woods near the Wood home just outside of Gates. He lost sight of the man, Wood said, but a moment later saw a car start up and leave at a high rate of speed.

He chased the car in his own car and stopped it, he said, and found Tours as the driver and only occupant.

Tours was later arrested on a complaint signed by Woods and posted bail on the charge pending trial.

No sentence was levied after the completion of the trial Wednesday morning. The trial started Tuesday morning and was continued again Wednesday when there was not time to complete it Tuesday.

It was indicated Wednesday that Tours may make a motion for retrial or a motion for dismissal notwithstanding the verdict.

The Smiths moved to Salem from Iowa and on moving here farmed in the Brush College community. They moved into Salem from Brush College in 1928. Mrs. Smith was a member of the Seventh Day Adventist church.

Survivors include a daughter, Mrs. W. M. (Janet) McMorris of Salem; six sons, Charles Asa Smith, George Elmer Smith, Arnel J. Smith and Clifford L. Smith, all of Salem, William E. Smith of Eugene and Harvey C. Smith of Spokane; 17 grandchildren and 23 great-grandchildren.

The time of the funeral services will be announced later by the Clough-Barrick chapel. Interment will be in the ena cemetery.

Leslie Briggs Dies Tuesday

Leslie E. Briggs, who for several years was with the maintenance department at Willamette University, died at his home at 1250 North Winter street Tuesday.

Briggs, who retired three years ago, had been in ill health for the past five years. He was born at Blockton, Iowa, April 23, 1885.
