### Plane Plants To Stay Open Despite Riots

FARMINGDALE, N.Y. — The Republic Aviation Corp. plans to keep its strikebound plants open despite renewed violence that boiled up on picket lines last night. "The company," said Vice President John J. Ryan, "will take all necessary steps in the courts and with law enforcement agencies to restore law and order. Republic intends to keep its plants open."

A spokesman for the International Assn. of Machinists said none of Republic's 12,000 production workers reported for work on the first full day of the wage strike yesterday. A company spokesman said, how-

ever, the deliveries of the atom-bomb-carrying Thunderstreaks and other commitments to the U.S. Air Force will continue. Republic has a backlog of half a billion dollars in government orders for jet fighter-bombers and guided missiles. About 7,000 engineers, scientists, supervisors and office employees at the firm's four Long Island plants did not go on strike with the production workers early Sunday. The main plant is here and three smaller ones are at Port Washington, Greenlawn and Hicksville. Justin Ostro, president of the union's Republic local, offered to supply 4,000 passes for office employees so they could get through picket lines unharmed. A group of first-swinging strikers surged and shouted against non-strikers who tried to break through picket lines yesterday morning and again last night. Cars were backed up for a mile outside the gates of the main plant here when night shift non-strikers

came to work. Pickets closed human walls against approaching cars. Some hurled themselves into the hoods of the cars. Many persons suffered bloody noses, black eyes and bruises. More than 50 pickets, including Ostro, were arrested on assault or disorderly conduct charges. They were released on bond. **Julius la Rosa To Wed April 7** MANITOWOC, Wis. ### Oregon Slated For New Mill

The International Paper company plans to construct a paper and paperboard mill in Oregon as its planned merger with the Long Bell Lumber company is consummated, according to a telegram received Tuesday by the Capital Journal from International's New York office. "We believe this will materially increase competition in the pulp and paper industry throughout all the western states without any adverse effect on the lumber industry," the wire said, adding: "A mill such as we contemplate would provide many new employment opportunities, provide for a more complete utilization of the timber harvest in the Northwest and generally make a substantial contribution

to the growing industrial economy of the region." A decision on the merger is not expected before early April. Questions of its legality have been raised by government agencies. **Beaverton Gets Phone Expansion** BEAVERTON — The West Coast Telephone Co. has allotted \$1,937,000 of a \$9,209,000 construction program to this district, Lyle E. Cross, Beaverton, district manager, disclosed today.
