### Nixon Terms Words of Ike 'Exactly Right'

#### Hal Says VP Pleased With Eisenhower's Statement

WASHINGTON (AP)—"Exactly right" is Vice President Nixon's word for the short-of-endorsement commendation President Eisenhower has given him, says chairman Leonard W. Hall of the Republican National Committee.

The GOP chairman, talking with reporters at the White House after a 30-minute conference with Eisenhower Monday, said Nixon had told him that "a couple of times." Eisenhower at his news conference last week renewed his frequently voiced praise of Nixon as a man and an associate but stopped short of stating direct support of Nixon for a second round as No. 2 man on the Republican ticket.

Eisenhower said he had told Nixon to "chart his own course and tell me what he would like to do."

Eisenhower has made the point that picking a vice presidential nominee customarily waits on the selection of a choice for President. Hall said he and Eisenhower did not discuss the question of whether Nixon should be his running mate again.

For himself, Hal repeated what he has been saying all along—that he assumes the ticket will be Eisenhower and Nixon.

"It seems to me that everybody is concerned about the vice presidency except Dick Nixon," Hall said.

"Nixon feels that the President has handled the situation exactly right."

Asked whether he expects convention time will come around before there is any public word on Nixon's response to the Eisenhower request that he chart his own course, Hall said he doesn't know. The Republican nominating convention opens in San Francisco Aug. 20.

Another question was whether any Republican leaders have expressed to Hall any concern lest Nixon be a political liability on the ticket. Hall replied that he has no information on that except what he has seen in various polls. "I would say that as far as the (Republican) organization is concerned, Mr. Nixon rates very high," Hall said.

He said he visited Eisenhower to give "a general report on operations," including party financing.

### 120-Story Building Planned in St. Louis

ST. LOUIS (AP)—A preliminary plan for a 120-story building—16 stories taller than the Empire State Building in New York, the world's tallest—has been submitted to the St. Louis County Council by a private development company.

The Andabon Investment and Development Co., headed by Ira Fleishman of St. Louis, proposed the project Monday.

### Theft Total Said \$1500

Value of articles recovered by local police officials in the arrest of three juvenile burglars grew to \$1500 early Tuesday with more still being hidden away.

City, county and state police are still searching for the loot gained by the youths in midnight forays into Salem homes during the past few months.

One of the boys, a 14-year-old, was released to custody of his parents by circuit Judge Joseph Felton. The other two, one 15 and another 17 years old, are being held in the city jail.

A hearing was tentatively scheduled for Tuesday in Marion County Juvenile Court for the two now cooling their heels in the city jail.

The arrests apparently clear up a series of break-ins that have been harassing police during the past few months in this area.

### 'Richard III' Rated at 19.1

NEW YORK (AP)—The Trendex rating gave NBC's Sunday telecast of Shakespeare's Richard III a rating of 19.1 per cent against assorted afternoon opposition. The 19.1 per cent rating was said to compare favorably with the ratings of well-established evening programs such as the Phil Silvers show and the U. S. Steel hour.

### Neuberger to Press Lobby Inquiry Move

#### McClellan Hunts Space To Get His Probe Under Way

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. Neuberger (D-Ore.) said Tuesday he will press his proposal for creation of a special commission of private citizens to investigate campaign contributions and any improper influences on Congress. The Senate already has set up a special bipartisan committee of eight senators to conduct such an inquiry under chairmanship of Sen. McClellan (D-Ark).

Neuberger said he regards it as "an outstanding committee," but that he believes "the most effective way" to conduct such an inquiry would be to assign it to some outside commission appointed by the chief justice of the United States and "broadly representative

of the major interests in American life." Meanwhile, McClellan announced he is "house hunting" on Capitol Hill for suitable headquarters for his special committee. He said he has not yet started selecting a staff.

On a related front Sen. Johnson of Texas, the Senate Democratic leader, told the Senate Monday night 83 of its 95 members (it has one vacancy) have lined up as co-sponsors of an "honest elections" bill he and Sen. Knowland of California, the Republican leader, have introduced.

Among other things the measure calls for full reporting of campaign contributions and expenditures and, he said, would "set realistic ceilings on spending—ceilings which are low enough to be meaningful but high enough to remove the invitation to evasion that now exists."

### Rites Set for Van Den Bosch

MONMOUTH — Richard Van Den Bosch, 79, retired sawmill operator, died in a Dallas hospital Sunday. Mr. Van Den Bosch was born Nov. 8, 1876, at Zeeland, Mich. He married Wjda Wentworth in 1897 at Aberdeen, Wash., and shortly afterwards moved to Falls City. He settled in the Pedee district,

Rt. 2, Monmouth, 30 years ago and operated mills in that district until his retirement a few years ago. Mr. Van Den Bosch was a member of Luckiamute Lodge No. 150, A.F.O.E. A.M. at Falls City, and the Eastern Star. He was chairman of the Falls County Welfare Board for several years.

Surviving are his wife, two sons, Richard L. Dallas, and Wentworth P. Van Den Bosch, Tigard; four brothers in Michigan, four grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

p.m. Wednesday, March 14, at Bollinger Funeral Home, with the Rev. F. J. Paul officiating. Graveside services will be conducted by the Masonic order in Fir Crest cemetery, Monmouth.
