It's Wonderful to Watch the Old Hollywood Pros Perform

 HOLLYWOOD Whether they're on a baseball diamond, a tennis court or a movie stage, it's wonderful to watch the old pros at work.
 Two of the best pros are working together out at MGM these days. Barbara Stanwyck and James Cagney are playing in "All Our Yesterdays." Together they know just about all there is to know about film acting.
 They went through the rehearsal of a long scene with utter precision. Yet despite their familiarity with the scene, they brought their characters alive. There was nothing mechanical about their work. As I watched them, I couldn't help comparing their craftsmanship with the new T-shirt and tantrum school of acting.
 Afterwards, I collared Cagney and asked him what he thought about these young actors who believe in scratching their bellies or doing anything that comes naturally.
 "Well, it seems to me it's all a difference between the subjective and objective schools of acting," he replied. "These kids believe acting is all subjective. They bury themselves in the character and get so wrapped up in that they don't let the audience in on it. I think that's a mistake."
 "I still think acting is a matter of projection. You work out a character, then you project it to the audience. That's all there is to it."
 Sounds simple, doesn't it? But it becomes an art when practiced by a talent like Cagney.

Hawaii's Easter Poster Girl Faces Philippines Deportation

 HONOLULU (UP)—Hawaii's 1956 poster girl for the annual Easter Seal drive faced today the prospect of deportation to the Philippines within three months because of a change in diagnosis of her illness.
 Her parents said deportation of five-year-old Mary Arce at this time would be practically the same as signing her death warrant. They blame the U. S. Immigration and Naturalization Service, but the local agent in charge says his hands are tied by the law and regulations laid down by Congress and there's nothing he can do about it.
 When Mary was admitted to the United States with her alien mother for medical treatment in 1953, her illness was diagnosed as polio. Since then, she has been certified to be suffering from a form of epilepsy, an illness that the law says automatically excludes her from U. S. entry.

Naturalized Citizen
 Mary's father, Mauricio Arce, is a naturalized American citizen, and so are two younger children who were born in Hawaii after the mother came here. Under the law Mrs. Arce can apply for permanent residency on the strength of her husband's citizenship.
 However, immigration authorities have told her that they will not approve her application for permanent residence until Mary leaves the country. Instead, they gave the two a "final" three-month extension on March 8.
 The harassed parents have engaged the services of attorney Elmer E. Paston, who specializes in immigration law and until recently was director of the Honolulu office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service.
 Paston said he hopes to convince local immigration authorities that they do have the right to extend indefinitely Mary's residence in the United States as long as she is under medical treatment. He said that, failing that, it would take a special act of congress to save the girl from deportation.

Suffers Mild Convulsions
 Arce, a carpenter, said that if Mary is deported the entire family would have to go back to an uncertain future in the Philippines. "They don't have facilities for

 The evangelist reported to the President on his recently completed trip around the world, which included a visit to India and a talk with Prime Minister Nehru.
