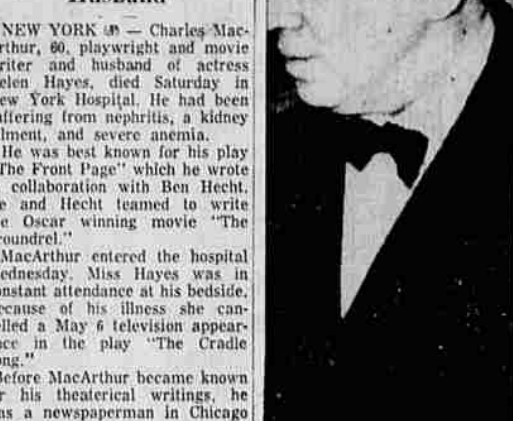

Former Newspaperman Helen Hayes' Husband NEW YORK (AP)—Charles MacArthur, 60, playwright and movie writer and husband of actress Helen Hayes, died Saturday in New York Hospital...
