

Wilsonville Folk Say Hospital Important Area Development

Selection of a site near Wilsonville for the new state mental hospital will receive an expression of appreciation Thursday night from the Civic Club there, which is headed by Hal Sweeney, Salem manager for United Air Lines.

Among the speakers will be Stanley Grove, manager of the Salem Chamber of Commerce, and J. H. Van Winkle, manager of the Oregon City chamber.

The Wilsonville people believe the hospital will be important in the community development.

Wilsonville has started negotiations with government authorities relative to the possible piping of water through the Willamette Valley from Detroit or Big Chiff reservoirs for municipal and industrial use, and that will be a subject for discussion Thursday night. They believe that not only their own community, but

also Silverton, McMinnville, Newberg, Oregon city, West Linn and other communities could benefit.

The proposal is in very early preliminary stages. The Wilsonville people have written Senators Morse and Neuberger and Representative Walter Norblad who have referred the matter to the army engineers. A report

from the army engineers since received at Wilsonville advises the people there to take it up with Col. Jackson Graham, district army engineer in Portland. It is believed surplus water from the reservoirs might be permitted as long as it did not interfere with the regular purposes of the dam project. Formation of a water district by the communities has been suggested.

Another discussion at the Wilsonville club meeting will be about a park and landscaping project along the Salem-Portland Freeway.

Methodists Set Up New Pension Plan

TACOMA (AP) — Ministers and lay leaders attending the annual Pacific Northwest conference of the Methodist Church Wednesday approved the establishment of the first reserve pension plan in the nation for clergymen and their families.

Under the terms of the plan all the funds collected during the minister's service with the church would be available to him upon retirement. In the past retirement funds collected one year were paid out the next.

In other actions, the conference: 1. Voted to take over administration of the 110-bed General Hospital at Richland. The hospital would be renamed the Kadelee Methodist Hospital.

2. Approved sale of the church's Wide Hollow properties near Yakima to the Church of the Nazarene.
