

### Oregon Has Little to Fear From Quakes

BERKELEY, Calif. — The big catastrophe insurance headache is the possibility of a runaway atomic reactor, a Philadelphia underwriter told the first World Conference on Earthquake Engineering Tuesday.

E. T. Erickson, secretary-manager of the Fire Assn. of Philadelphia, told the 300 delegates that damage from a runaway reactor "could be astronomical."

He said insurance men are aware of the hazards from earthquakes but have learned to live with them and will continue to write quake insurance.

Oregon is the one Pacific Coast state that has little to worry about from earthquakes, Dr. Perry Dyer, University of California seismologist, said in a speech prepared for afternoon delivery.

He said the Pacific ring of epicenters is far enough off the Oregon coast to protect the state, while in Washington and California the epicenters break on land. Seismologists, engineers and architects from quake areas throughout the world are attending the conference.

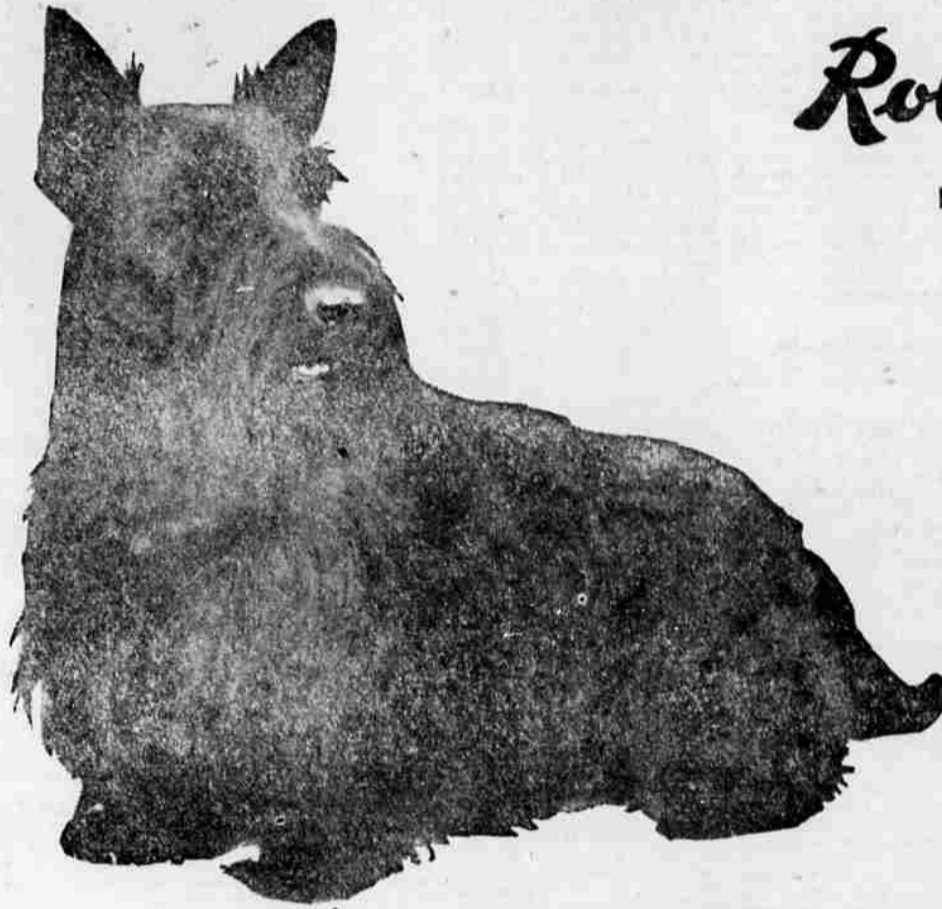
CORVALLIS — Log prices generally held firm as lumber and plywood sales picked up last week, the weekly farm forest products report of Oregon State College said Tuesday.

peelable mill logs and there was a spotty drop of \$5 to \$10 a thousand feet for peeler logs.

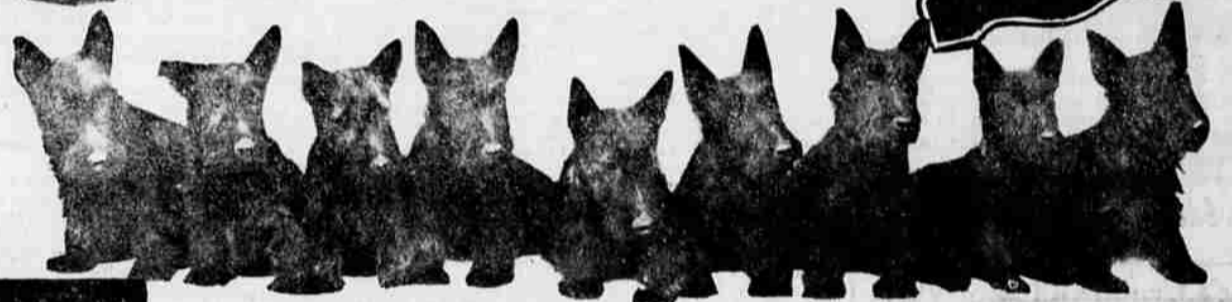

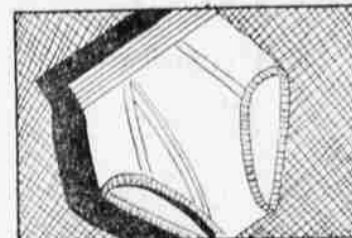


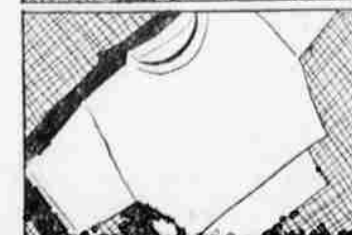
