NEW YORK—An open letter to Steve Allen:

Dear Steve: Word comes to this department that you're planning to book Elvis Presley, the hysterical shouter of rock 'n' roll, for your second regular weekly NBC-TV show Sunday evening, July 1, Why?

Until now I've refrained from joining in the chorus of public and critical condemnation of Presley's primitive exploitation on the Million Bells show a couple of weeks ago. My theory is that characters like Presley thrive on a bad press. The more they're condemned, the more people are aroused to watch and listen to them.

Obviously, however, my thinking that something unpleasant would go away if ignored was wishful and foolish. For now, so soon, you apparently plan to bring Elvis the Pelvis back to a national television network to titillate teenage girls and cause numbness boys to imitate him.

I'm not taking a moral stand in this case. Better watchdogs than I already have bayed a warning and the patrols are out. My purpose in asking why you're booking Presley has another basis. Your television career has been marked by a high sense of value and a great respect for talent. Presley certainly is not funny—though that is not my complaint against him. My argument against his appearance is simply lack of talent. I can't for the life of me see why you want to have such an untalented boy on your program.

A very small but very noisy minority of the immature have been infected in recent years by the dig-a-boom convulsions known as rock 'n' roll. There is no talent involved in their rigorous efforts at self-torture.

Possibly you feel that Presley should put on one of his performances on your program because he is somehow an "American phenomenon." There are lots of American phenomena. One, for example, is Niagara Falls. You could train TV cameras on the Falls for five minutes and you'd have a phenomenon all right—but you wouldn't have much of an audience left. Because the Falls, for television purposes, are untalented and noisy and all wet.

Budget Meet Set at Molalla

MOLALLA—This Friday Molalla residents will have an opportunity to discuss with the city council estimates on the newly-prepared city budget. The meeting will open at 8 p.m. The budget committee prepared the estimates in May, and wish to exceed the 4 percent limitation by \$18,628.57.

Two items of interest are the 7½ percent increase in salaries of city employees, with the exception of the manager of Timberland housing project; and the \$13,500 budgeted for sewer construction. Total estimated expenditures for the 1956-57 fiscal year are \$126,870. Receipts are estimated at \$76,237.09. The total levy will be \$77,537.39 and \$18,628.57 is in excess of the 4 percent limitation.

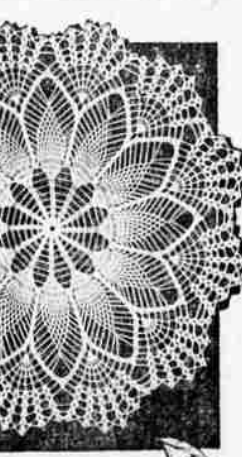

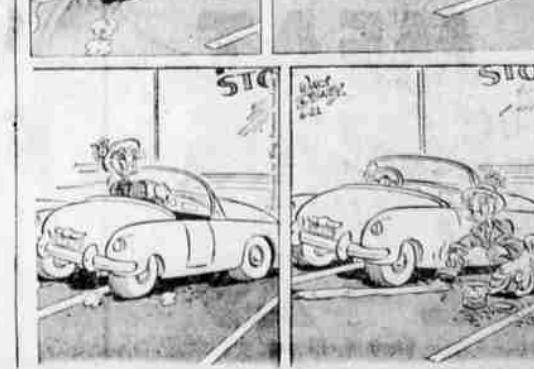
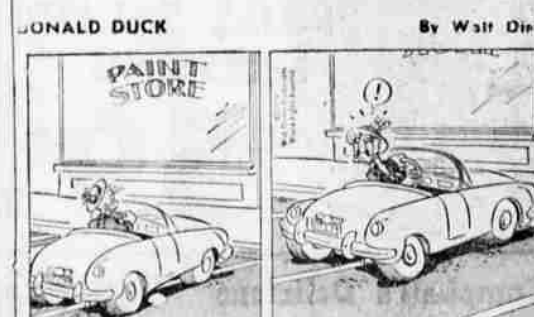
