

Three Public Hearings Set By Planners

Procedure Changes Will Get Study At Meeting

Three moves designed to smooth procedures of the Salem planning commission are expected to be given careful consideration at a commission meeting Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. at the city hall.

Three Public Hearings
The commission will also hold three public hearings. These are scheduled before the other matters of business and include:

Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company request for permission to build an addition 65 feet high, about 20 feet higher than the zone allows, to its plant, 75 feet high, at 740 State St.; Milton Chappell's petition to change the zone of a lot adjoining his grocery store at Lee and Mission streets from R4 residential to C3 business; and DeArmond and Sherman's application for a zone change from R1 residential and M1 light industry to M2 heavy industry for part of the old housing colony site between Cross and Wilbur streets in southeast Salem.

The changes in procedure are proposed to speed work of the commission and to avert misunderstandings.

The commission seeks the best means of preventing changes in plans after they have been approved by the commission and before they are recorded at the courthouse.

They also may require copies of the section of the zoning code listing all uses to which the property could be put to be attached to all petitions circulated for zoning changes.

Two Legal Meetings
A third change would establish two legal meetings a month for the commission. At present there is one legal meeting and usually a nonofficial session to aid in catching up with the workload.

Other matters which the commission will discuss include clarification of street dedications, in the area southeast of Silverton road and Lansing avenue, which is undergoing annexation to Salem; a petition from residents to change the name of Mason street to Saginaw street; and a request from Christian and Missionary Alliance church for permission to tear down an old church and build a new one in a C3 commercial zone at Fifth and Gains streets in North Salem.

Youth Sent to State Hospital

A 16-year-old Silverton youth accused of committing several Salem area burglaries, was committed to the state hospital Monday for 30 days observation.

The youth, Ronald Eugene Huffman, and Raymond Sander Ainge, 16, of MacLaren School for Boys, were arrested in connection with six burglaries committed almost two weeks ago in Woodburn and Gervais.

Ainge was transferred Monday from MacLaren to the county jail for a court hearing.

A third Silverton youth, 17-year-old Emory Dwight Leighty, is scheduled for a juvenile court hearing Thursday. Leighty was arrested as an alleged accomplice of the two younger boys in a burglary of the East Side Market at Silverton and Lancaster roads.

The latter burglary occurred prior to the Woodburn and Gervais incidents, of which only Ainge and Huffman are accused.

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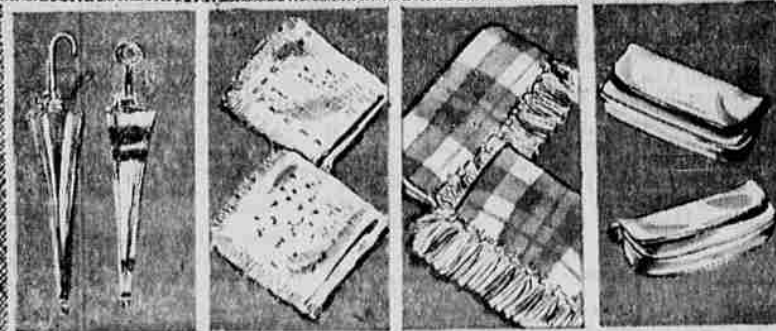
