NATO Offers Scholarships

The North Atlantic Treaty Organization will sponsor a scholarship program to delve into the common traditions and needs of the North American area.

The project will include a series of exchanges among the NATO countries in two divisions: research fellowship and scholarship. The Board of Foreign Scholarships will select the American candidates, whose names will be submitted by the Department of State to NATO's international selection committee for final decision.

Candidates with some language proficiency and graduate training will be given preference for placement in non-English speaking countries.

Grants will include 500,000 French francs, plus travel expenses for an academic year.
