

Adlai Says Ike Tells 'Only Half the Facts'

Deplores Brushoff Of Call for Halt Of H-Tests

WASHINGTON (AP)—Adlai Stevenson contends President Eisenhower related "only half the facts" about the global peace picture and indicted churchmen and political leaders the world over in dismissing Stevenson's proposal for ending H-bomb tests.

In a speedy reply to his GOP opponent, the Democratic presidential nominee last night told a cheering campaign audience at nearby Silver Spring, Md., that in discussing the international situation Eisenhower "left out any mention of the ominous tensions which today mark Africa and the Middle East."

Stevenson addressed an overflow crowd in the 2,800-seat auditorium of Montgomery Blair High School just 24 hours after Eisenhower had delivered a nationwide radio-television address giving a generally optimistic report on administration efforts to achieve peace during world peace.

Kefauver Hits At Brownell's D-Y Case Role

MISSOULA, Mont. (AP)—Sen. Estes Kefauver, the Democratic vice-presidential candidate, said today that Atty. Gen. Brownell's role in the Dixon-Yates case "doesn't smell good."

"This administration has much to be ashamed of in the Dixon-Yates scandal," he said in a statement, "and it can hardly be proud of its attorney general."

Kefauver renewed his assault on the canceled Dixon-Yates power contract before leaving for Oregon, where the administration's power policies are a major issue in the election campaign.

His visit takes him into Oregon two days behind Vice President Nixon, who told an audience at Eugene that the nation's power resources can best be developed under the administration's "Partnership" program with local and private groups.

This drew a report from Kefauver in a speech last night that Nixon had told "a whopper" and that Republican "truth squads" assigned to follow Democratic campaigners had better get on Nixon's trail.

"This sounds more like the old Nixon, treating so lightly with the truth," Kefauver said.

"The truth is that not one single kilowatt-hour of electricity has been produced under the Eisenhower partnership policy."

"Gen. Eisenhower will not let the American people have the power developed in their own rivers unless it just goes through a private utility toll-gate."

Kefauver was scheduled to deliver his speech at a party rally at Kallispell, Mont., but he had to leave it piped by telephone from Missoula after bad weather prevented his plane from reaching Kallispell.

Women Lead Men in Multnomah Registry

PORTLAND (AP)—There are more registered women voters in Multnomah County than men, James W. Gleason, registrar of elections, said Thursday.

In the Republican Party, women hold a 9,181 lead over the men—62,912 to 53,731. The GOP total was 116,643.

There were 70,931 Democratic women registered compared with 68,402 men for a total of 139,333.

BOGGED IN RED TAPE

U.S.-Russ Swap of Magazines Stalled

NEW YORK (AP)—For two months the projected Soviet-American exchange of official propaganda periodicals has been tangled in red tape.

There is no indication it will get unsnarled soon. Thousands of copies of the Soviet government's English-language magazine, U.S.S.R., are lying in a Manhattan warehouse. Thousands of copies of the Russian-language Amerika are stacked up in the American Embassy in Moscow.

State Department officials said today negotiations are going on in Moscow over the question of how big a cut the official Soviet government distribution agency is going to take from the sale price of Amerika.

The Soviet government intends to price U.S.S.R. at 20 cents on American newsstands. American News Co. declines to indicate exactly how much of this the Soviet Embassy will get—but informed guesses are that it is likely to be a little over half.

4 States Can Fill Europe's Oil Need Gap

Suez Emergency Could Be Met by Letting Wells Run More

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP)—Four states have crude oil to spare and could fill the gap with ease should the Suez crisis deprive Western Europe of its Middle East oil supply.

Texas, Louisiana, Oklahoma and New Mexico could meet the emergency simply by letting their wells run longer.

Transportation might become a major problem but the supply problem would be nothing more than turning valves and throwing pump switches.

The four states last week produced 4,576,000 barrels of crude oil daily. This was 64.6 percent of the nation's output. Another two million barrels daily in excess productive capacity was kept idle by lack of market demand.

Conservation officials from the four states on Tuesday advised C. A. Stewart, director of the Interior Department's Oil and Gas Division, that oil to meet a possible Western Europe emergency could be made available immediately.

Texas could boost its production by a million barrels daily, Louisiana by some 285,000 to 300,000, Oklahoma by 125,000, and New Mexico by 100,000 barrels.

Stewart estimated that an additional 500,000 barrels of United States crude would be needed daily should tanker traffic through the Suez be halted. The figure would jump to 1,000,000 barrels a day should Middle East pipe lines to Mediterranean ports also be cut off.

William J. Murray, Jr., chairman of the Texas Railroad Commission, said Texas could boost production by 1,076,000 barrels a day without affecting basic conservation policies.

"The state's production could be changed about as quickly as we learn the facts," he said, adding that a current 15-day per-drilling production schedule could be boosted to 25 days if necessary.

The other state estimates came from Ray C. Jones, chairman of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission; John Hussey, Louisiana conservation commissioner; and Warren Menkin of the New Mexico State Oil Conservation Commission.
