

2-Way Radios Approved for Road Workers

For the more efficient operation of county business, especially in the road building department, the county commissioners authorized Tuesday the establishment of a two-way radio system. The system will include the installation of a base station, probably at the county shops and the placing of an estimated 10 outlets in mobile equipment. The court authorized the radio program upon the recommendation of County Engineer John Anderson who has conducted an investigation of the benefits to be derived. The county currently has three machines with radios controlled from the sheriff's office. Anderson said he would recommend the placing of 10 outlets.

A representative of one of the larger radio equipment firms, was in court Tuesday. He said that the firm that got the contract under bid would have a monopoly of the installation of radios in the county equipment.

Two public hearings have been set by Salem Planning Commission for City Hall Oct. 9. Elmer Investment Co. is seeking relief from a side yard setback in order to erect a business building at 64 N. Church street. Mrs. Vivian Damaske will ask permission to build a house at 1595 S. 20th St. in an industrial zone where new home construction is now prohibited by the zoning code.

City Council Okays Voter Sound Truck

The Democratic Central committee has received city council permission to operate a sound truck to encourage potential voters to register, but it was made clear that there would be no political advertising on the vehicle. A sound car, which was to provide music for a Veterans of World War I parade here last week was prohibited from participating after it was found to carry posters urging election of a political candidate. Alderman P. W. Hale, who presented the request for the registration sound car from John Horn, county Democratic chairman, said he had been assured that the vehicle would bear no party or candidate's name. The deadline for voter registration is October 6.

Truck Dispute Quickly Ends

PORTLAND — A dispute over the firing of a driver touched off a work stoppage Monday at Consolidated Freightways' terminal here, but it lasted only a little while. Some 450 teamsters employed by the company quit work and set up a picket line, but went back to work after the ousted driver, Donald Rohrer of Portland, got back his job. Rohrer had been fired for refusing to cross a picket line at the strike-bound Swift and Co. packing plant. Consolidated spokesman Neil Broady said later that its contract with the Teamsters provides that drivers cannot be fired for refusing to cross a picket line.
