

Fruit Compote with Cake Squares Beverage DOUBLE CORN SPOONBREAD Ingredients: 1 can (8% ounces) whole-kernel corn, 1 package (8% oupres) spoonbread mix, water, mik, eggs, 2 canned whole pimi-entos (drained and diced). Method: Drain corn; reserve ling

Method: Drain corn: reserve li-quid. Make up spoonbread using the corn liquid for part of the water called for in the package directions: after adding the amount of milk and the number of eggs directed on package, slir in drained corn and pimiento. Turn into well-buttered baking dish (1½ quarts). Bake in hot (400 degrees) oven 35 to 40 minutes. Serve at once, removing portions with large spoon. Makes 5 to 8 servings. Spoonbread will puff up like a souffle and be moist inside.
