

Air Force Firepower Thrills Writing Group at Air Show

EGLIN AFB, Fla., Oct. 7 (Special)—It was a great show of air power that the U.S. Air Force gave some 6,000 persons here today for the aerial firepower demonstrations. Persons came from all over the U.S.A. and Canada and South America for the demonstration.

Bombers tossed bombs into the air and flew off and left them before they had started their descent to their targets, jets broke through the sound barrier and even the old Standard E-1 World War I fighter made its appearance. In fact the World War I fighter was the second plane to perform. The first was a formation of F-100s passing through the sonic barrier in a dive from 43,000 feet.

Trained in Salem
In the parade of planes also was the F-51 World War II fighter, which many in Salem will probably remember was first flown over Germany by a squadron that trained in Salem in World War II with Maj. James H. Howard, now a brigadier general in the air force reserves, as the commander. The squadron switched to the Mustangs after leaving Salem.

The first operational jet fighter, the F-80, now used as a drone aircraft at Eglin; the F-86, the famous Korean fighter that had a 14 to one kill ratio against the Russian built MIG-15; and the F-100, present supersonic fighter, which was the first to break the speed of sound in straight and level flight, were all in the parade of planes that opened the demonstration, which also included a demonstration of the firing of air force armament weapons.

Bombing, Strafing Shows
The present-day supersonic interceptor the F-102, called the Iron Dart by many, and the first plane with the delta wing was also presented.

Giving a demonstration of precision flying in their Thunderbirds was the famous United States Air Force demonstration team, organized in May 1953, who today were making their 23rd precision flight.

Bombing and strafing are still a very important part of air power and pilots showed their skill in hitting the target with both bombs and their guns. Four F-80s bombed a simulated factory, while an F-100, an F-101 and F-94B strafed simulated enemy aircraft, all hitting their marks.

Bombers showed how bombing had advanced since the skip bombing of World War II, demonstrating the loss bombing technique at 60 degrees, 90 degrees, and 110 degrees. In each instance the bomber had tossed the bomb and was out of the area before the bomb began its descent on its target.

Former Oregonian
The demonstration attracted many high ranking military men and civilians in prominent positions. Among them was a former Oregonian, Gen. Nathan Twining, chief of staff for air, whom a number will remember for his National Guard days in Oregon. Also in the group was the under secretary for the Air Force. All were guests of the commander of the Air Proving Ground Command, Maj. Gen. Robert W. Burns.

Signal Hearing Set on Oct. 17

The Marion county court has been notified that the Oregon Public Utilities commission has set Wednesday, October 17, as the time for a hearing on the county's application for the installation of an electrically-operated automatic warning signal at the Boone Road intersection of the Southern Pacific railroad.

Residents of the area had petitioned the court for the warning signal on the ground that the crossing presented a serious hazard to traffic using the county road.

Butler Blasts At 'Hypocrisy' Of Truth Unit

WASHINGTON 10 — Chairman Paul M. Butler of the Democratic National Committee Thursday accused a dozen members of the Republican "truth squad" of "hypocrisy" on the basis of votes in Congress against Eisenhower administration policy.

Democratic headquarters released a study of 26 roll calls in the House and Senate, each of which showed from one to six of the traveling GOP campaigners opposing the administration stand.

Along with the tabulation the committee issued a statement by Butler saying: "It is ironic that the Republican Party should select the very men who refused to support Mr. Eisenhower in the Congress to campaign for his re-election as president. And it is sheer hypocrisy on the part of the 'truth squad' members to stand up and speak for the re-election of the man they voted against on crucial issues in the Congress."

The assignment of the "truth squad" is to follow up Democratic candidates and give the GOP side on which the Republicans view as misstatements in campaign speeches.

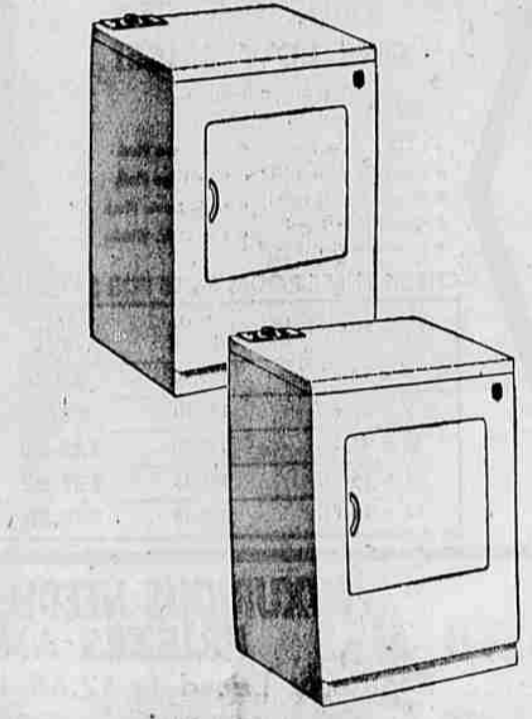

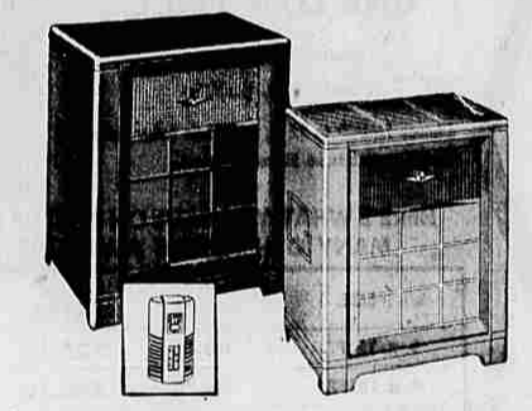

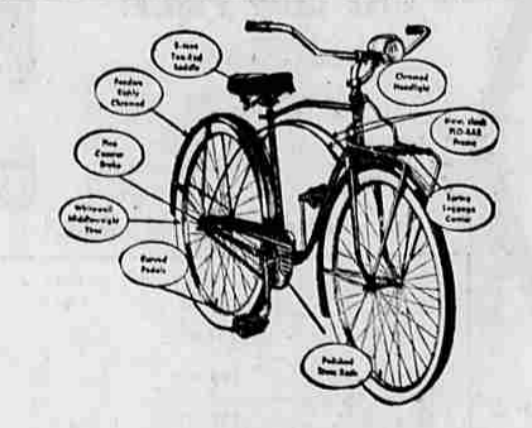
