Carrot Slaw Beverage

CARAWAY BRUSSELS SPROUTS
Ingredients: 1 quart basket (about 2 pounds) Brussels sprouts, clear chicken stock, 3 tablespoons butter or margarine, salt, pepper, 2 teaspoons whole caraway seeds.
Method: Wash Brussels sprouts in cold water; remove wilted leaves and soak in salted water about 30 minutes. Rinse and place in saucpan with 1 inch of boiling chicken stock. Bring to boiling point; boil 3 minutes without cover. Cover and boil until tender—crisp—10 to 20 minutes. Drain if necessary. Add butter, salt, and pepper to taste and caraway seed. Cook lightly. Serve at once. Makes 4 servings.
