\$498.2 Million In U.S. Taxes Paid by State

WASHINGTON (Special) — The Internal Revenue Service reported Tuesday the tax bills paid at its Portland, Ore., office for the year ending June 30, 1956 totaled \$498,205,000.

The largest part of this was in income and employment taxes—\$474,166,000. Income taxes withheld from paychecks total \$129,605,000. Withheld income tax and old age insurance was reported at \$241,532,000; railroad retirement withholdings at \$2,425,000; and unemployment insurance at \$2,320,000.

Corporation income and profits taxes were reported at \$98,174,000. Other taxes collected included: Estate taxes, \$6,706,000; gift taxes \$644,000; alcohol taxes, \$3,568,000; and other excise taxes, \$13,121,000. The agency listed these totals for occupational tax stamps: \$200, wholesale distilled spirits dealers, 124; \$50, retail distilled spirits dealers, 2,778; \$100, manufacturer of non-beverage products, 3; \$110, brewers producing more than 500 barrels; \$100, wholesale beer dealers, 56; \$22, retail beer dealers, 2,695; \$2.20 per month, temporary dealers in beer and wine, 62.

Narcotics — \$24, manufacture of opium, 1; \$12, wholesale dealers, 20; \$3, retail dealers, 537; \$1, practitioners, 2,748; \$1, dealers in untaxed preparations, 4; \$1, practitioners dispensing marijuana, 2. Coin operated devices, etc., — \$20, billiard or pool room and bowling alleys, 430; \$10, amusement devices on premises, 3,677; \$250, gaming devices on premises, 125; \$50, wagering, 110.

The total number of special taxpayers was reported at 13,394.
